The Workaholic

In the last cabinet, OBE was fondly referred to as 'Mr. Project'. The conception, presentation and execution of projects in all sectors of governance were personally and thoroughly monitored by Alhaji Monsuru Oloyede Bello OBE.

Upon assumption of office, he synergized the leadership of the political structure in Ejigbo to be on same page to consolidate polls gain. As the Executive Chairman, his administration style was all embracing as he demonstrated high sense of intellectual capability in managing the technocrats.

OBE is accurate, proactive, detailed and thorough to a fault. He would interpret constructions drawings; provide adequate professional advice from inception to the terminal stage.

OBE is a team builder. He ensured every member of his team was involved in decision making.

I recall him involving the tripartite team (Legislative, cabinet and management) in the 120 CDA tour across the six wards in Ejigbo. The initiating department was the Agriculture and social service unit. The HOD/Supervisor draws up workable visit plan; OBE reviews the plan and invoke all interwoven departments to ensure the visit is successful. The information unit and security are the advance team on ground. The office of the SLG liaised with the party echelon and legislative so they are informed about the visit.

The appellation, "Oloyede Bello is Excellent" OBE was evident during the hosting of the wife of the Executive Governor of Lagos, Dr. (Mrs). Ibijoke Sanwo-Olu who had come to flag off the Child-Birth Mother Paternity week in Ejigbo. All tripartite members worked till break of dawn to ensure a successful hosting.

OBE personally supervised the entire preparations. He would come hourly to assess and review the work-in-progress of the event planner, sitting arrangement and Public Address system. He is a leader that assigns a job and does regular follow-up to ensure that task is not derailed or quality compromised. In this instance, the workaholic OBE left the council around 5am and returned to the council at 7am to in order to receive the advance protocol of the wife of the governor. In the remark of the wife of the governor, she commended the chairman for the benefitting and colourful venue.

A vivid example of OBE's Workaholics and thoroughness are seen at budget retreat sessions where all the tripartite teams are lodged at comfortable and serene locations for a full knowledge engagement, analysing all income, attributing causes of shortfalls and tasking the department in charge for improvement. Necessary refreshment are provided to ensure participation. He brings expert in budget planning to educate and broaden team players understanding on budgeting.

Furthermore, the expenditure heads are reviewed department by department and each department defend convincingly and justify their budget. It has always been an OBE budget marathon stretch.

As the first indigenous Executive chairman of Ejigbo Local Council Development Council, OBE is well informed about the entire area. The road network, topography, landscape and streets of Ejigbo are all at OBE's fingertips!

With this knowledge capacity, grading of streets construction of culverts and roads were easily approved by the cabinet. At a stakeholder meeting at a Community Centre known as "NNOKWA Hall, the

decision to ease traffic congestion at the ever busy Jakande Gate was top on the agenda and therefore, the idea of constructing the feeder road at Kashiwo Alimi street was birthed.. This road linked NNPC with Jakande Estate. This implied that motorists going to Jakande Estate, Ijegan and beyond would have no reason to drive as far as Jakande before diverting. An interlocking stone paced was brought, all cabinet visited the site and approval was given.

As a leader who is passionate and vast on the study of the environment, the impact of waste management was felt with the effort and support of the Hon. Monsuru Oloyede Bello. It came to his notice

that we had sabotaged dumping of wastes indiscriminately at night on the medians and drainages. Our indefatigable and workaholic chairman activated his ever supportive tripartite team to keep surveillance for three days between 10pm and 4am. He strategically divided the team into three groups and each group manned strategic locations. He requested for security operatives to be part of the surveillance. This strategy proved effective as saboteurs were apprehended and handed over to the police.

As the chief security officer of Ejigbo, OBE never compromised anything that had to do with security. His monthly statutory peace and

security had been paramount in his administration. He jointly led the NPF, NLSC and community security in confronting cult groups and dismantling their hideouts. He also fought tooth and nail to curb the menace of rape and domestic violence in Ejigbo and its environs.

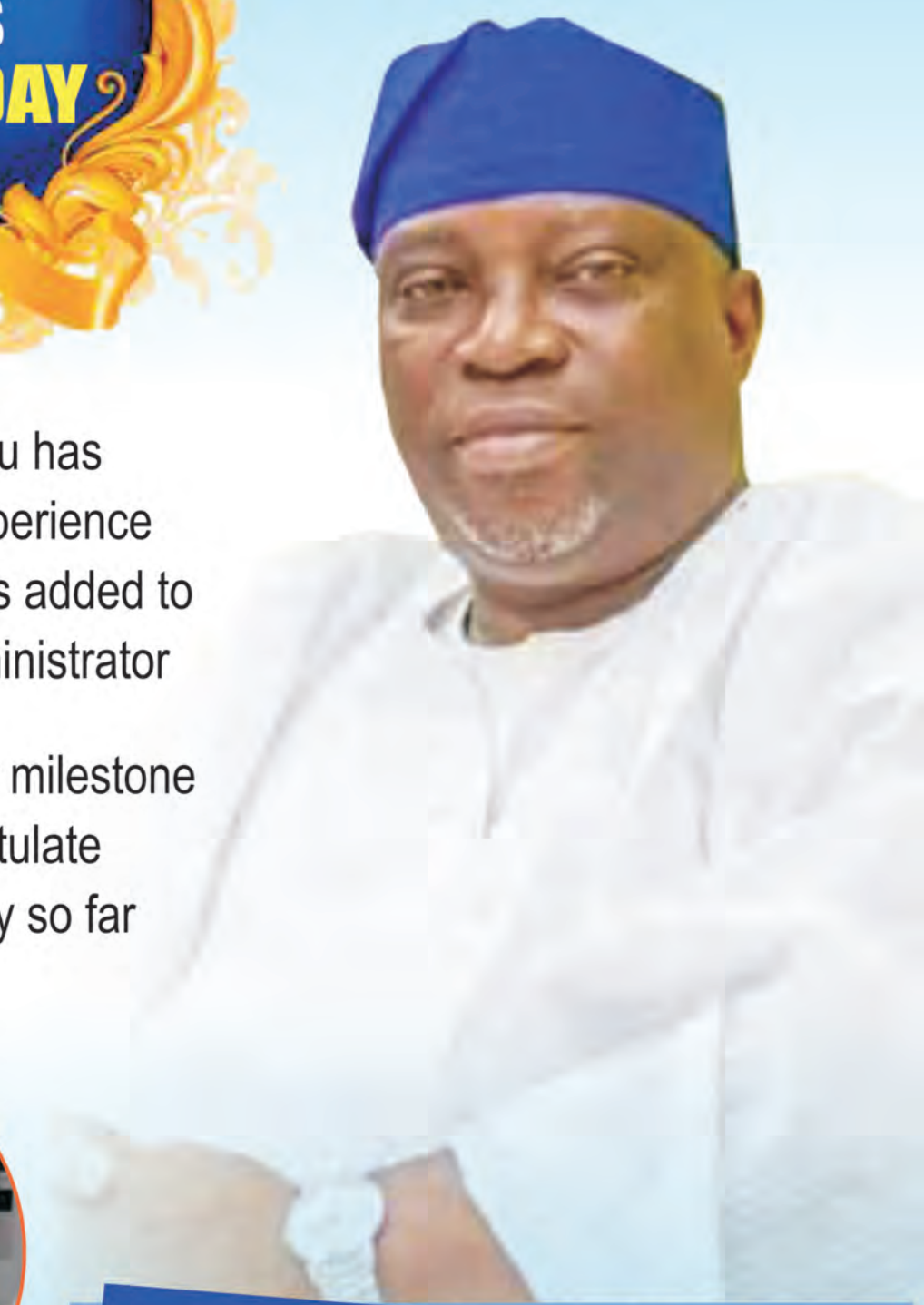

Birthday Garlands for Mr Infrastructure

His towering accomplishments have earned him the sobriquet, Mr. Infrastructure.

The Number One citizen of Ejigbo Local Council Development Area (LCDA), Alhaji Monsuru Oloyede Bello, popularly known as Obe, is a stranger to the limelight. Deferring to remain in the shadows, he rather prefers to make his works speak for him and it has been speaking eloquently since 2017 when he mounted the driving seat of the local council.

Obe is a perfect example of the popular maxim; the best things come in small packages. Soft-spoken, easy-going but focused on the job. It was no surprise he was rewarded with a second term in office earlier this year to continue his giant strides and bequeath more infrastructure to Ejigbo LCDA. His performance has also debunked the oft-held belief that the local government system in Nigeria is associated with executive non-performance.

The story of Obe's excellent performance in office predates his assumption into office. Before his election in 2017, he had dutifully served as Vice Chairman of Ejigbo LCDA during the administration of Mr. Kehinde Bamigbetan. It was therefore an easy choice in 2014 when he was endorsed by majority of party stakeholders to succeed the chairman, Bamigbetan, who was bowing out after a successful tenure of two terms of six years on the saddle.

As vice chairman, Bello doubled as the Supervisor for Works, enabling him to ensure the delivery of the administration's capital projects such as Asiwaju Bola Tinubu Primary School, Ageke; Oladele Alake Primary School, Ailegun; the Abbotir, Ailegun; Primary Health Care Centre, Low Cost Housing Estate; Primary Health Care Centre, Ageke; and Primary Health Care, Ifoshi ward. He also supervised the rehabilitation of 10 roads and the grading of over 500 roads.

He was therefore prepared to take on the new assignment headlong. Until his emergence, it was the cliché that subventions and allocations to LGAs are only for payment of salaries only.

However, rather than join the bandwagon of executive complainants who defend their non performance in the Local Government system in the country, Mr Infrastructure focused on delivering his own dividends of democracy to his constituents, thereby breaking a record in Nigeria's history. In just about 60 days after his swearing-in ceremony, he had constructed three roads, built two health centers and added three schools to the achievements before he marked his first 100 days in office.

Despite the LCDA being a densely populated community excised from the strategic Oshodi Local Government Area, Alhaji Obe has been in a race against time to upgrade the council with critically needed infrastructure even in his second term.

His untiring efforts at getting the pulse of the people and bringing governance closer to the grassroots makes him embark on regular inspection tours of communities in the council, which provides him with firsthand information of what the electorates want.

When asked one of the challenges he has faced in office during a recent interview, he replied: "The drains, drains and drains. They are a major challenge here and we will not relent until they are sorted out."

"As you know, most of these drains were built decades ago. Of course, at the time they were built, they successfully checked floods, but at that time and as of now, they were not constructed for people to clog it with debris and all manner of filth."

This is why we are unrelenting in getting the understanding of residents on the need to adopt proper waste management attitude. The drain is a major priority for our administration. All the roads we have constructed or rehabilitated so far are strategic and our drains are critical to the lifespan of the roads.

"Also, the dream of residents, to bid bad roads, in the council goodbye, will soon be realised, as the council is addressing the problems."

On the issue of infrastructure, Obe said: "The council decided to pay special attention to infrastructural development to improve the

quality of our environment and the living standard in our area, our projects are sustainable and important to the needs of our people."

This he has been able to achieve through proper planning and projects monitoring before they are completed, alongside his team of experienced executive, legislative and management personnel.

The council has constructed and rehabilitated over 13 roads, which includes rehabilitation of Moshalashi road, Agbonmagbin road, Jakande Estate road, Kolawole Sebilu road, Alh. Nurudeen Obe street, Ifoshi road, Rafiu Tijani among others.

The council also braved the rains and COVID-19 lockdown to complete a signature project, the link road at Kashimawo Alimi by NNPC

bus-stop, which was reconstructed with interlocking blocks. The road leads to Bungalow area and serves as an alternative to the congestion at Jakande Gate bus-stop.

When asked why he seems to be in a great haste and hardly in the office except for meetings, Obe said: "I agree. I am in a haste to deliver on my manifesto. I had told the electorate during my campaign that I would do this and that. It was a promise clearly stated and circulated. I know that a promise is a debt, which I must pay. I also believe that I must begin to fulfill my promise as soon as possible without delay because time is of great essence. I am not one to give excuses for not keeping promises. So you are correct if you say I am in haste. I must visit the health centres under

construction or the schools and the roads daily for personal supervision."

"My experience as Vice Chairman of Ejigbo under Hon Kehinde Bamigbetan opened my eyes about what leadership at the local government level is all about so I came very prepared and experienced on how to deliver on my manifesto. I see governance as a God-given opportunity to serve the people and no time should be wasted while doing the job. The masses have been enduring for long, so wasting time on the saddle is uncalled for."

"Prudent and strategic management of the so called low funding is the crux of the matter. You have to be very prudent in allocating the resources. Again the determination to get things done no matter all the odds is

another factor. Where there is a will there must be a way."

On what informed his choice of the locations for the roads, schools and health centres, he replied: "It was strategic thinking. Population of residents keeps increasing that we reasoned that more schools and health centres are necessary so that pupils don't have to trek too far to school while healthcare won't be far to get for pregnant women, nursing mothers and children especially."

"For the roads, we thought about the most strategic roads to link up with ease. The stretch of Moshalashi road linking up to the NNPC road is strategic, just like the Rafiu Tijani is important to link up with the famous busy Egbe road in the LCDA. We have also done some palliative activities on state roads to make it passable until ongoing work gets there."

PROFILE OF OLOYEDE

The underline euphoria of the historical and reflective statement by Malcolm X, published in 1965 in the book, *The Autobiography of Malcolm X* by Malcolm X with Alex Haley is condignly the spirit in the personality of the present Executive Chairman of Ejigbo Local Council Development Area, Alhaji (Hon.) Monsurudeen Oloyede Bello (OBE). Malcolm X said, "I'm for truth, no matter who tells it. I'm for justice, no matter who it is for or against. I'm a human being, first and foremost, and as such I'm for whoever and whatever benefits humanity as a whole."

Born on the 5th of November, 1967, exactly 122 days into the Nigerian civil war. It is right to say that the aura of the time of his birth implanted in him, Oloyede the energy of community activism and the deep roots in rural community development. Although his family was deeply involved in the community leadership steering, Oloyede questioned the youth involvement in the process of the grassroots political decisions making. This disposition led him to be selected and served as ward polling agent of UPN during the 1979 election organised by the Federal Electoral Commission (FEDECO); which was constituted by the regime of General Olusegun Obasanjo, to organise the elections of 1979 that ushered in the Nigerian Second Republic under the leadership of Alhaji Shehu Shagari. This service earned him the nick name Omokekere-Agent.

The wish for political utopia continued through much of his adolescence, initially leading him to join forces with the youth of the community under the aegis of Ejigbo Indigenes Forum to agitate for the creation of Ejigbo Local Government in 2003. The dream came through and incidentally he is chairing the governance power of the

actualization of the dream. But in his junior year, Oloyede took to social activities as pivotal community mobilization for positive purposeful living. Co-establishing an association known as The Young Stars Club of Ejigbo, he channeled his energy from 1985 – 1992 on the members of the club to focus on the pursuit of academic careers as instruments for personal and community growth. The club later transformed into a new association known as Friendship Club of Ejigbo.

Born into the famous family of Akinsanya Ajaloleru of Imakiyo Chieftaincy Family and Fadu Mewon family of Ejigbo of Late Alhaji Nurudeen Adio Bello, popularly known as Obe and Alhaja Tawakalitu Bello; Monsuru had his elementary primary education between 1975 - 1980/81. He proceeded to Ejigbo Community High School and completed his secondary education in the 1987/88 session. He completed his National Diploma (ND) at the Lagos State Polytechnic in the year 1994/95. In these years, especially between 1992 – 1994; he chaired the Elders Council, which was the governing body of the Students Association of the

Marketing Department. His stewardship in the period recorded unprecedented achievements in the area of students' academic awareness and focus.

He furthered his education by attending the Federal Polytechnic, Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State and obtained a Higher National Diploma (HND) in 1998. It was in this period that he served as the Chairman of the Electoral Committee of the Students Association of the Marketing Department in 1996 - 1998. This period could be said to be his consolidation of his experience in defending and advancing democracy, and

more broadly understanding and fostering condition for human dignity in the grassroots. Similarly, in 2004, he proceeded to Ladoke Akintola University, Ogbomoso in Oyo State, for his Post Graduate (PGD) course and he was not only focusing on his studies but he was also garnering leadership experience. He therefore served as Chairman, Board of Trustee of the Students Association of the Marketing Department between 2010 – 2012.

In March 2000, he started his working career with Lagos State Government, Ministry of Works and Infrastructure;

and was later on posted to work at State Government's Civil Service Commission. Finally, he worked as an Executive Officer (GD) with the Lagos State Ministry of Transportation. He resigned in 2008 from the service of the Lagos State Government in order to pursue his political career. Between 2000 – 2008 he worked tirelessly with the other youth of the community, especially with the writer for the unification of the indigenous families of the Ejigbo. One of the outstanding events of this period was the reconciliatory Meeting, which was held on October 14, 2001 at Igando to re-unite all the traditional

ruling houses in the community. The event was organised through Ejigbo Indigenes Forum – Lagos, the organisation that chaired at a point and became the major financier of the its activities.

In 2008, Oloyede was elected as the Vice Chairman of Ejigbo LCDA for the 2008-2011 administration of Hon. Kehinde Bamigbetan (the immediate past Commissioner for Information and Strategy, Lagos State). He was re-elected as the Vice Chairman of Ejigbo LCDA for the 2011-2014 administration to continue serving under the administration of Hon. Bamigbetan. During those two tenures, he also doubled as supervisory Council for Works and committed for community development.

On July 24th, 2017 Hon. Bello became an elected "leader" - the Executive Chairman of Ejigbo LCDA, Lagos State, and he runs the office till date. In the article titled, OBE: Development An Astute Community Enunciator published in Itokasi, Community Development Committee of Ejigbo LCDA Newsletter (March 2021 edition), he is describes as "not just a leader; he is also a manager. He has been able to co-ordinate and guide human and material resources, in order to achieve the goals of his administration and Ejigbo LCDA at large. What an exceptional leader! In just two years of leadership, the Chairman has achieved a lot. With a winning team who have a good understanding of the goals of the administration, OBE has performed several people-oriented projects, led by positive example, supported community activities and charitable causes, e.t.c. His administration has witnessed uncountable achievements in areas of Infrastructure, Education, Health, Agriculture, Empowerment, Peace and Security, e.t.c." As Bill Taylor rightly opinionated in the article Leadership Test?, "the true mark of a leader is the willingness to stick with a bold course of action... the only way to stand out from the crowd is to stand for something special." Oloyede is indeed a special activist.

I still remember that evening in 2008 at a private rendezvous set up to unravel the unknown. My collaborator, popular as Kuranga, assured me it was going to be a meeting of likeminds. Knowing Kuranga to harbour that trait in the character of politicians called incurable optimism, I did not set much store on his assurances. I looked forward to the crowned prince.

Monsuru had been crowned by the party as the vice chairman in a fence-mending and basket weaving strategy to make sure all the tendencies in the Action Congress work together to win rival parties at the local government polls in October, same year.

As the chairmanship candidate and flagbearer, it was important to meet with him and ensure that we get along. From the little intelligence from the grapevine, he was born into the political family of Pa Nurudeen Obe, a man whose words had a lot of weight when mobilising the grassroots in Oshodi-Isolo in the 80's and 90's. Monsuru was also on the ballot to run for councillorship.

Behind his politics, I gathered, was deep commitment to the cause of the Awori in Ejigbo in particular. He was the youth leader stirring the agitation for indigenous rights. As it often matters, the militancy of youths hardly sits with the conservative culture of the men on the throne..

These stories were going through my mind as we arrived the fastfood joint in Ikeja GRA and met him. He was waiting for us.

We greeted and I looked into his eyes. I liked what I saw. I told him right there that what I saw in him was brotherhood and comradeship adding that if we sincerely aimed to develop Ejigbo, there would be no basis for a quarrel.

We hit it off as soon as we were elected. From his records as a civil servant, he had considerable knowledge of administrative procedures

and was conversant with the culture of work at Alausa, the state secretariat where I also worked as Chief Press Secretary to Governor Bola Tinubu, the Asiwaju.

We flagged off a three month familiarisation with the landscape of the city, trekking from street to street, identifying the challenges to be faced and problems to be solved.

The exercise brought out the workaholic in him. He was tireless and enthusiastic about our priorities. When it was time to implement the Vision 3 x 3, a programme I designed and sold to the party and the people, he demonstrated total commitment to our implementation plan..At no time was there any reason to look over my shoulder or doubt his sincerity.

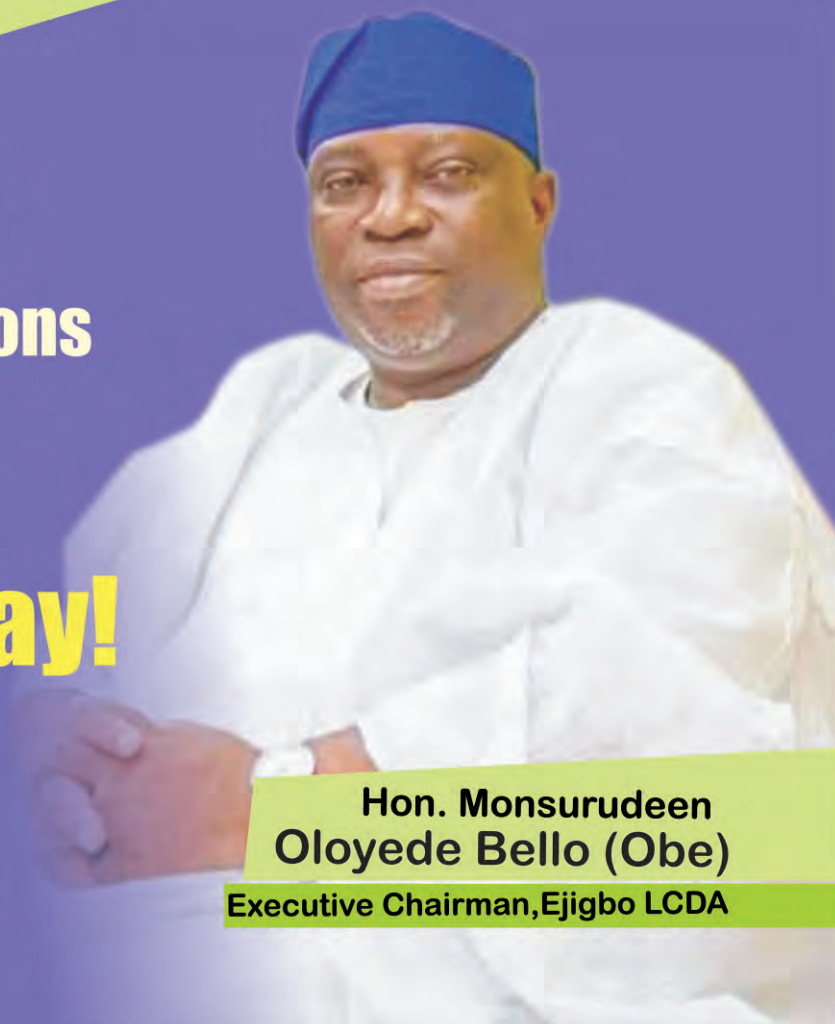
