Valentine's Day: How Mental Illness'll Deprive Many of Love

No fewer than 79 mentally unstable people in Lagos Destitute Rehabilitation Centre may be deprived of love as the world marks Valentine's Day. This is due to Lagos outdated lunacy law that had deprived them of referral to quality hospital where they can be cured and reabsorbed into the normal society.

Every February 14, the world celebrates Valentine's Day to express love with exchange of gifts and pleasantries and in a way, the Lagos State Parks and Garden Agency LASPARK has opened over 340 parks and gardens to fun seekers.

However, hundreds of residents who are mentally unstable will not be visiting the parks and gardens. They are restricted with in the rehabilitation centre with lesser hope of getting well soon due to Lagos obsolete lunacylaw.

According to a study, Psychiatric Morbidity among residents of this centre there is steady increase in the rate of mental illness among unemployed youths in the state.

The study by Ayodele Olurotimi Coker of the Department of Behavioural Medicine, Lagos State University College of Medicine investigated residents of a destitute rehabilitation centre for psychiatric morbidity and found

that almost half of them are battling with one mental illness or another.

"" They were interviewed one-on-one basis using the ICD-10 diagnostic criteria for presence of specific mental illness by a consultant psychiatrist," the study noted.

It states that the majority of the participants 400 (94.7%) were unemployed, single 187 (44.3%) and 353 (83.6%) lived on the streets.

t h e Among participants, 137 (32%) were diagnosed with schizophrenia, 89 (32.4%), mental and behavioural disorders due to alcohol and multiple substance abuse, 51 (12.1%), antisocial personality disorder, 13 (7.1%) mania and (1.8%) had severe depression The association of drug use between males and females were found to be statistically



significant (X2=7.874, DF=1, P=.005).

The study showed that the residents of the investigated destitute rehabilitation centre had high prevalence of mental illness.

This is coming months a f t e r L a g o s g o v e r n m e n t confirmed that 79 out of 450 miscreants relocated out of the state showed signs of

insanity.

The 79 were absorbed into government facilities but finding shows that there has not been referral to special facilities where their unwellness could be taken care of.

The Lagos State Commissioner for Information and Strategy, Gbenga Omotosho disclosed that the 450 miscreants were evacuated to free Lagos of "visible security risks."

Recall that the operatives of the Rapid Response Squad (RRS) of the Lagos State Police Command arrested a man claiming to be insane in possession of 22 ATM credit cards, 2 mobile phones and power bank in Victoria Island area of Lagos.

The man, Lanrewaju


Jaiyeola, 39, was intercepted by the operatives where he was sighted in a suspicious manner carrying a backpack on Ozumba Nbadiwe Road.



However, the Centre For Mental Health and Initiative had called on the state to do something about the lunacy law, which it describes as one of the outdated laws the state must review.

The centre said that the government must address the pathology responsible for lunacy and not just limiting the law to the whole philosophical undertone of merely ridding society of persons considered "insane".

""It is not enough to put such persons under restrictive custody of the state without addressing the pathology responsible for his or her condition, the law must be amended to do more,"the centre said.

Lunacy Ordinance was enacted in 1916 and gives medical practitioners and magistrates the power to detain people with mental illness. The law has not been amended since 1958. The Act fails to provide persons with mental disorders deliberate treatment and a possible re-integration into society.



50 Civil Servants With Disabilities Get LASODA Work Tools

he Lagos State Office for Disability Affairs (LASODA) has presented work tools and assistive devices to about 50 civil servants with disabilities in the state. Cheques of N1,100,000:00 (One Million, One Hundred Thousand Naira) each were also handed to 11 individuals to procure prosthetics, aimed at enhancing their independence and productivity.

Speaking during the official presentation of the items, which took place at the STO Resource Centre, Ikeja, on Monday, the General Manager of LASODA, Mrs. Adenike Oyetunde-Lawal, emphasised that the initiative was designed to empower, promote inclusion, and increase accessibility for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs), particularly those employed by the State Government.

She noted that, in recent years, the Agency had received numerous requests from state civil servants with disabilities seeking work tools to help them perform their duties. This presentation is a step toward fulfilling that vision for PWDs in the state civil service.

In her words, "Today, we are presenting: 23 laptops, 9 laptops with speech-assisted software (Freedom Scientific Version 2024) for our visually impaired colleagues, as well as calipers and motorized



Police Inspector Sentenced To Death By Felix Kuyinu



police inspector in Lagos, Paul Joseph, has been sentenced to death by hanging over a murder incident in Lagos.

Joseph was on trial at the Lagos High Court in Tafawa Balewa before Justice Sherifat Sonaike for murder of the victim identified as Moshood Ismail.

At the proceedings, the offender was said

to have shot the deceased during a patrol in Aguda area of the state on March 28, 2019, thus, violating the provisions of the Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2015. Justice Sonaike said: "The defendant admitted to patrolling the area on the day of the incident and acknowledged that

someone had died from a gunshot.

"His behaviour, along with other evidence, confirmed his guilt. The manner in which the fatal shot was fired indicated a clear intent to kill or cause grievous harm.

"The use of a live weapon and the fatal wound inflicted leave no doubt that the defendant caused the death.

Tik-Toker Jailed For Impersonating American Citizen By Felix Kuyinu

Federal High Court in Lagos has seen a transgressor, Olamide Bello, sentenced to prison over impersonation. At the proceeding, Bello, who pleaded guilty to the offences, was said to have impersonated an American citizen on TikTok. He was sentenced to three years in prison.

The court judge, Justice Alexander Owoeye, after

finding him guilty, gave the offender an option of fine in the sum of N600,000 in

Additionally, the court ruled on the forfeiture of the convict's iPhones 14 pro Max and a GLK 2013 model, to the Federal Nigeria.

His sentence will read back from December 6, 2024, when he was arrested, as ruled by the judge. Bello, who was

apprehended by the Economic Finacial Crimes Commission, EFCC, paraded himself on the social media as Keanu Reeves, an American citizen in guise of defrauding unsuspecting victims. According EFCC Government of counsel, Chineye Okeze, the offence committed contravened Sections 22 (2), (b), of the Cybercrimes **Prohibition Prevention** Act 2015.



Lagos To Prioritise Wetland Conservation With New Policy

he Lagos State Government on Sunday said the State is currently developing an Environmental Policy on Wetlands and Biodiversity to balance development with nature conservation.

The Commissioner for the Environment and Water Resources, Mr. Tokunbo Wahab, stated this in a release issued as part of the year 2025 World Wetland Day celebration. He stated that the State Government

remains committed to protecting Wetlands and their Biodiversity, stressing that the policy will ensure that all future projects in or around wetlands undergo a comprehensive Environmental Impact Assessment, in line with International best practices.

In his words, "Wetlands are nature's endowment to man due to the many benefits it provides, especially for sustenance. We must understand

that we do not exclusively own the right to wetlands as our children and their children deserve the right to these same resources". Speaking on the 2025 theme: "Protecting Westlands For Our Common Future", he emphasised the need for sustainability concerning wetland usage and exploitation. Lagos State Government joins the rest of the world to commemorate the 2025 edition of World Wetlands Day to spread the message through different multimedia platforms by creating public enlightenment to address the increasing degradation, clearing and reclamation of Wetlands and their Biodiversity".

The Commissioner explained that it is

unfortunate that with human activities and migration into Lagos, wetlands have come under increased threats with a loss of over 100km2 between 2014 and 2022 owing to urban settlement.

He added that the government understands the need for development but strongly emphasised the need for Sustainable Development where wetlands are not just overexploited and encroached upon by the strength of one's purchasing power.

Wahab said to conserve some of the pristine wetlands, the Government had preserved the Wetlands in Orugbo-Iddo, Epe and Iyafin, Badagry, with plans to develop these wetlands for tourism purposes.

He stressed that the government had also scaled up monitoring of wetlands by putting measures in place to ensure that violators of wetlands are severely punished and would no longer allow people to encroach upon wetlands without requisite approvals.

He said the government understands the place of partnership with sister MDAs, NGOs, Traditional Institutions and International Organizations in safeguarding wetlands. He added that continued collaboration with willing stakeholders in the environmental sector and beyond will always be prioritised to ensure sustainability because it requires all hands to be on deck to avert the total loss of wetlands across the state.

The Commissioner also charged residents in the communities around wetlands to desist from indiscriminately dumping waste in wetland areas and ensure that the construction of buildings is not blocking the runoff of water along all drainage channels.



Battery Users

ngoing blackout in Epe have disrupts businesses and daily activities and left many wondering if electricity supply will ever returned, as the Community turned to MOPO Battery users as an alternative to electricity and expensive fuel-powered generators.

Community members are beginning to suspect a deliberate ploy to keep MOPO in business at their expense.

MOPO batteries, introduced by MOPO Company, operate on a pay-per-use model, allowing users to rent portable batteries to charge their phones and small devices without relying on the national grid.

The company had only one office in Epe, but with the growing demand, they have now set up agents almost everywhere, making access easier than ever.

Mr Tunde, a resident of Ayetoro said the way MOPO is expanding in Epe, it's like they don't even want the light to come back, before, we had to go to their office to get a battery, but now, their agents are in almost every street, making huge profits from our suffering."

Speaking with a representative of MOPO, he confirmed the company's rapid growth, stating that their service has become a necessity due to the prolonged power crisis.

"MOPO has been a

game-changer for Epe residents. With just a one-time registration fee of 500 and proper identification (BVN, NIN, and house address), users get a wristband tracker that allows them to rent batteries for only 600 per day.

We provide a reliable power source at a time when the community needs it most," he explained that MOPO battery comes with strict security features, including a built-in 500lumen light and a tracking system that ensures it can only be charged within the MOPO ecosystem, also records transaction details and usage patterns via the MOPO Charge Unit or MOPO

Many residents appreciate the convenience, others are growing uncomfortable with the increasing reliance on MOPO,



fearing that the widespread adoption of the batteries might delay efforts to restore stable electricity.

Mrs. Folake, a trader in Ita-Opo said, MOPO was a lifesaver, but now it seems like we are being forced to depend on it permanently, nobody is talking about bringing back electricity. Every day, people are renting MOPO batteries, and they are making millions. Is this the

new normal life for us?" Bashir Sanni, laments and expressed frustration over the lack of updates on power

restoration.


