Sex Scandal: Police Interrupt Pastor Okafor's Honeymoon

The Lagos State Police Command has interrupted the one-month honeymoon of the founder of Mountain of Liberation and Miracle Ministries, Ojodu also known as Liberation City, Pastor Chris Okafor, following ongoing investigations into allegations of sexual misconduct circulating on social media.

The allegations, which surfaced on December 15, 2025, were made by Nollywood actress Doris Ogala, who accused the cleric of emotional and financial harm arising from an alleged personal relationship. Pastor Okafor has not publicly responded in detail to the claims.

In the wake of the controversy, Pastor Okafor announced to his congregation that he would temporarily step aside from active pastoral duties throughout January 2026, citing the need for spiritual retreat, rest, family time and honeymoon following his recent marriage.

However, police authorities confirmed that the retreat and honeymoon were halted after the command commenced investigations into multiple petitions submitted against the cleric.

According to the Lagos State Commissioner of Police, CP Olohundare Jimoh, Pastor Okafor was invited for questioning but initially failed to appear in person, sending his lawyer instead, who reportedly informed investigators that his client was on retreat.

"We waited for him to appear on the date his lawyer indicated, and when he did not show up, I directed that he should be arrested," CP Jimoh said. "Subsequently, he presented himself."

The commissioner confirmed that the case has since been transferred to the Assistant Inspector-General of Police in charge

of Zone 2, AIG Sylvester Alabi, for further investigation.

Prior to the emergence of the allegations, Pastor Okafor had faced criticism from some residents of the Ojodu area of Lagos over property acquisitions linked to the expansion of his church headquarters.

Over the past decade, he reportedly acquired several residential properties along Oshofisan Street, off Ereke Street, which were later demolished and redeveloped as part of the ministry's expansion.

One of the properties, located on Alhaja Tijani Street, previously housed Zion Parish of the Redeemed Christian Church of God (RCCG). According to former parish members, the landlord requested the church to vacate the premises after the building changed ownership.

"We had to move to another RCCG parish within the council area after the property housing our church was sold," a former

parishioner told Echonews, requesting anonymity. "We reported the matter to the church authorities and were advised to relocate peacefully."

Community sources further disclosed that attempts by Pastor Okafor to acquire additional adjoining properties, including a family-owned house on Oshofisan Street, were resisted by the owners. The street later benefited from

road rehabilitation works using interlocking stones.

Despite the controversies, Grace Nation International continues to attract large congregations, with Sunday services remaining well attended.

Some current members described the allegations against the cleric as attempts to undermine the church, insisting that they do not reflect their personal experiences.

A former church member, who requested anonymity, said she stopped attending services due to concerns over what she described as "unverified miracle claims," while acknowledging the church's popularity.

An executive member of the Alhaja Tijani Community Development Association, Mr. Kabiru Oloyede, said the church has contributed positively to the community, particularly in infrastructure development.

"The church single-handedly rehabilitated Oshofisan Street, and the pastor pays community levies regularly," he said. "However, I cannot comment on issues relating to his personal life."

Pastor Okafor has stated that during his temporary absence, pastoral responsibilities are being overseen by Pastors Sylvester, Kelvin, Oliver, and Shadrach.

Police authorities say investigations are ongoing, and no charges have been filed as of the time of this report.

MVAA Boss Calls For Renewed Discipline, Professionalism Among Staff

The Permanent Secretary of the Motor Vehicle Administration Agency (MVAA), Mr. Rasheed Muri-Okunola, has called on all officers and staff of the Agency to embrace renewed discipline, professionalism and teamwork as the Agency begins the 2026 working year, describing the New Year as a fresh opportunity to consolidate recent gains and improve service delivery to the motoring public. conduct would not be tolerated. He assured staff of the Lagos State Government's continued commitment to staff welfare, capacity building and the provision of an enabling work environment, urging officers to reciprocate these efforts with diligence, compliance with rules and dedication to duty. LSTMB Collaborates With John Hopkins, Other Agencies To Tackle Clubfoot In Newborns

A partnership programme between the Lagos State Traditional Medicine Board, Johns Hopkins, General Hospital Odan, Lagos, and Lagos Island Maternity Hospital aimed at identifying and treating Congenital Talipes Equinovarus also called clubfoot in newborns was launched in Lagos, as part of the Project First Step initiative from the Bloomberg School of Public Health's M P H Field Experience Project.

The event brought together traditional birth attendants (TBAs) and traditional bone setters and sought to educate participants on early detection and referral of clubfoot cases.

In his welcome address, Dr Salami Olayinka, Head of Department of Orthopaedics at General Hospital Odan, emphasised the importance of interactive participation, stating that the topic is very important to TBAs and TBS in identifying club foot in children and making referrals.

Mrs. Aisha Adams, who represented the Acting Registrar of the Lagos State Traditional Medicine Board, Mr. Akeem Bello,

urged participants to be attentive and ask questions so as to greatly benefit from the lecture.

She said the Lagos State government always prioritises health matters, particularly when it comes to mother and child care, emphasising the need for timely referrals and advising against attributing clubfoot to spiritual afflictions, thus saving both mother and child.

Dr Adekule Nurudeen, Head of Orthopaedic Surgery at General Hospital Odan,

delivered a lecture on congenital talipes equinovarus, highlighting the importance of early diagnosis and referral.

He explained that clubfoot is a congenital deformity affecting 1-2 in 1,000 live births, with a higher incidence in males and often affecting the right foot.

Dr. Nurudeen outlined the treatment stages, including initial diagnosis, treatment, and maintenance, which can last up

to 4-5 years with periodic check-ups till skeletal age. His words, "Early diagnosis and referral to a specialist is key, Unfinished treatment could make the case come back, so we advise participants to educate parents to make sure treatment is done fully."

He also noted that treatment is fully funded by Johns Hopkins for newborns, meaning parents don't need to pay for treatment. However, this funding doesn't

cover older children, he noted. Dr. Obaitan Iretenevesho, one of the conveners of the programme, discussed identifying clubfoot cases and referral pathways. She said a form was designed for TBAs and TBS to facilitate smooth referrals to treatment centres, including General Hospital, Odan, Federal Medical Centre Ebutte Meta, General Hospital, Gbagada, LASUTH, Alimosho General Hospital, Igando, and National Orthopaedic

Hospital Igbobi, where treatment is available free of charge.

Also, part of the conveners, Miss Temisan David, emphasised the importance of the referral form, stating that it would be distributed through the Traditional Medicine Board to TBAs and TBS.

The programme aims to improve early detection and treatment of clubfoot in Lagos, while enhancing the quality of life for affected children and their families.





2026: Sanwo-Olu to complete transformational projects across Lagos

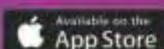

Lagos Approves Three - Month Rebate For Replacement of Faded Number Plates

The Lagos State Government has approved a three-month rebate window for motorists to replace faded and unreadable vehicle number plates, as part of renewed efforts to enhance road safety, improve vehicle identification, and strengthen security across the state.

This approval by the State Governor, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-Olu was disclosed by the Permanent Secretary, Motor Vehicles Administration Agency (MVAA), Mr. Rasheed Muri-Okunola, saying that the rebate is a proactive and citizen-friendly intervention aimed at encouraging compliance while reducing the financial burden on vehicle owners.

According to the Permanent Secretary, the condition of



vehicle number plates is critical to effective traffic management, crime detection, and overall public safety, noting that faded or illegible plates pose challenges to law enforcement agencies and traffic officials.

"Clear and properly maintained number plates are essential for vehicle identification and security. This three-month rebate is designed to give motorists ample

opportunity to replace faded plates at a reduced cost while supporting our collective responsibility to keep Lagos roads safe and well-regulated," Muri-Okunola stated.

He explained that the rebate applies specifically to vehicle owners whose number plates have become worn, faded, or unclear over time due to weather conditions and prolonged use. Motorists are therefore

encouraged to take advantage of the window by visiting the agency's designated Pilot Centre at Oshodi (MVAA One Stop Centre, Oshodi) or any MVAA Stations across the state for the replacement process.

The Permanent Secretary emphasised that the initiative aligns with the State Government's commitment to balancing enforcement with empathy while

promoting voluntary compliance through incentives rather than penalties.

He further noted that beyond aesthetics, legible number plates play a vital role in curbing traffic violations, aiding investigations, and supporting digital vehicle tracking systems deployed by the state.

"This is not just a regulatory exercise; it is a public safety measure. When

number plates are clear and standardised, it improves efficiency across transportation, security, and emergency response systems," he added.

Muri-Okunola assured the public of seamless service delivery throughout the rebate period and advised motorists to avoid unauthorised agents, stressing that all replacements must be processed through designated government-approved centres.

He reiterated the Lagos State Government's commitment to innovative policies that prioritise safety, convenience, and accountability while urging residents to cooperate with authorities in building a safer and more orderly transport environment.

Echonews reports that the summit marks the first of its kind in Lagos, signalling a renewed push by the state government to harmonise the activities of public agencies in pursuit of transparency, accountability, and effective governance.



African Startups Rebound as Investor Confidence Surges

African startups are experiencing a major comeback, capturing the attention and trust of investors both locally and globally. After years of cautious capital flows and uneven funding, 2025 marked a turning point, driven by stronger business fundamentals, innovative financing strategies, and a renewed focus on revenue-driven growth. The continent's tech ecosystem demonstrated its resilience, proving that African

startups can offer scalable, high-impact solutions capable of attracting serious investment. Following two years of declining funding — dropping from approximately \$3.5 billion in 2023 to \$2.2 billion in 2024 — the tide turned decisively in 2025. Total capital raised across equity, debt, and grants surged to around \$3.1–\$3.2 billion, a nearly 40 % year-on-year increase, surpassing levels seen in 2023. Large funding rounds surged as well, with 69 startups

securing \$10 million or more, marking a 70 % jump over 2024 and the second-highest annual total on record. Investors are now gravitating toward startups with robust unit economics, recurring revenue, and clear paths to profitability, moving away from the growth-at-all-costs approach that dominated previous years. Alternative financing structures like revenue-share models, inventory-based financing, and venture debt have also gained traction, diversifying capital options beyond traditional

equity investments. While fintech continues to dominate, capital is increasingly flowing into healthcare, agribusiness, AI, and climate tech — sectors tackling some of Africa's most pressing challenges with innovative solutions. Geographically, the funding landscape is becoming more balanced. While Nigeria remains a leading hub, countries like Kenya, South Africa, Egypt, and Senegal are emerging as strong investment destinations. Nearly one-third of

investors are now Africa-based, a trend that strengthens the ecosystem by anchoring capital locally and reducing dependence on international markets. Early 2025 activity highlighted the breadth of the recovery, with funding surges such as a \$289 million haul in January, a 240 % increase year-on-year. Experts say this resurgence reflects a maturing ecosystem, where disciplined investors are backing founders with clear product-market fit, scalable operations, and

sound financial planning, making Africa an increasingly attractive long-term investment destination. With digital adoption accelerating and innovation spreading across both core and frontier sectors, analysts predict that investor confidence will remain high in 2026 and beyond. Startups that combine scalable technology with strong revenue models are expected to lead the next wave of growth, signaling that Africa's startup renaissance is entering a new, sustainable and promising chapter.

Nigeria's Tax Overhaul Faces Its First True Test

Nigeria's ambitious tax reform, hailed as the most sweeping revamp of the country's fiscal framework in decades, has officially moved from legislative promise to real-world scrutiny as it rolls out in 2026. What looked like a landmark achievement on paper is now being measured against public trust, legal clarity, and investor confidence. Signed into law by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu in June 2025, the overhaul consolidates a patchwork of outdated statutes into four central acts: the Nigeria Tax Act, Nigeria Tax Administration Act, National Revenue Service (Establishment) Act, and the Joint Revenue Board (Establishment) Act. The reforms aim to expand the tax base, simplify compliance, and

modernise revenue collection across federal, state, and local levels. However, as the laws took effect on January 1, 2026, cracks in perception quickly appeared. Alleged discrepancies between versions passed by lawmakers and the officially gazetted documents have sparked questions

about transparency and legitimacy, turning the rollout into a litmus test of government credibility. Investor sentiment, already cautious, has been further challenged by concerns that higher capital gains taxes and stricter enforcement measures could weigh on returns and affect equity markets. Analysts are calling for clearer

communication from policymakers to stabilise confidence and prevent panic. Civil society groups like Enough is Enough (EiE) Nigeria have urged a pause in implementation, warning that the reform's success hinges not only on enforcement but on transparency, accountability, and public buy-in. Without these, voluntary compliance may falter, and resistance could grow, especially

among small businesses, informal sector operators, and everyday taxpayers long frustrated by the complexity of Nigeria's tax system. The coming months will show whether authorities can translate ambitious laws into practical, predictable, and user-friendly systems. Experts stress that even the best-designed policies will fail if implementation falls short on

fairness and clarity. As 2026 unfolds, Nigeria's tax overhaul is emerging as more than a fiscal policy shift — it is a test of governance maturity. How effectively the government manages enforcement, engages stakeholders, and communicates changes will determine whether these reforms cement fiscal stability or erode public confidence at a critical juncture.



NGX Soars to Africa's Top Three as Listings Hit 156

The Nigerian Exchange (NGX) has cemented its status as one of Africa's most dynamic capital markets, rising to third on the continent by number of listed companies, with 156 firms now quoted. Only Egypt's Exchange and South Africa's Johannesburg Stock Exchange surpass Nigeria in listings.

the bourse's growing influence, according to the OECD Africa Markets Report 2025.

Nigeria's capital market is notable not just for size but for diversity and depth, hosting leading companies across banking, telecommunications, manufacturing, energy, and

consumer goods. This breadth has helped the NGX weather regional volatility while attracting both domestic and international investors.

As of early 2026, the market capitalisation sits at roughly \$33 billion, anchored by heavyweights like MTN Nigeria, Dangote Cement, BUA Foods, and Airtel Africa.

Several firms have also crossed trillion-naira valuations, fueling liquidity and reinforcing investor confidence.

The NGX's rise reflects structural improvements in Nigeria's capital market, including regulatory reforms, easier access for retail investors, and incentives like zero per cent capital gains tax for small businesses and tax exemptions for

retail investors. These measures aim to deepen participation and attract new listings across sectors.

Analysts describe the NGX's momentum as a strong vote of confidence in Nigeria's corporate sector, even as trading adapts to macroeconomic shifts. Efforts to upgrade market infrastructure and

improve investor education are expected to sustain growth and draw additional foreign portfolio inflows in 2026.

With its growing roster of blue-chip and emerging companies, the NGX is increasingly viewed as a strategic platform for long-term investment and a key driver of economic growth across Africa.



Lagos Defends Minors' Arrest in Lekki-Epe Sweep

Lagos State is standing its ground after widespread criticism over the recent Lekki-Epe Expressway sweep that saw minors detained during enforcement operations. Officials insist the move was not intended to punish vulnerable children but to safeguard their lives and uphold public safety along one of the city's busiest highways.

The backlash intensified after videos circulated on social media showing young boys being apprehended, sparking outrage from influencers and activists. Reality star Tacha weighed in, condemning the arrests and urging the government to tackle the root causes of child poverty and street begging through support and empowerment

rather than punitive action. Responding to the criticism, Tokunbo Wahab, Lagos State Commissioner for Environment and Water Resources, defended the sweep as legally sound and safety-driven. Writing on social media platform X, Wahab highlighted the dangers children face when left to roam or work on high-speed roads, calling it "neglect,

not empathy," to allow minors to remain exposed to accidents and harm. The commissioner also pointed to government initiatives aimed at protecting and empowering youths, including tuition-free public schools and vocational programs in trades like fashion, shoemaking, and ICT. He explained that apprehended

children are carefully profiled — some reunited with families, others enrolled in state-supported training — emphasizing that the operation is part of a broader plan for long-term solutions. The incident has ignited debate over Lagos' law enforcement approach to managing street begging and public order. While critics call for more holistic social interventions,

officials argue that enforcement is necessary to ensure safe and orderly public spaces. As conversations continue across social media and traditional platforms, Lagos authorities reaffirm their commitment to a dual approach of law enforcement and welfare support, stressing that protecting children and maintaining public safety are equally critical goals.

West African Cinema Industry Hits N15.6 Billion in Box Office Revenue

The West African film industry recorded a remarkable performance in 2025, generating a total box office

gross of N15.6 billion from theatrical releases across the region.

Data compiled by FilmOne Entertainment showed that 2.79

million cinema-goers attended screenings in 2025, with 248 new films showcased across 122 cinemas in West Africa.

According to FilmOne's official

Instagram scorecard released on Tuesday, 16 movies crossed the N200 million mark, while 14 Nollywood films earned over N100 million. The average movie ticket price for the year was N5,596.

In the Nollywood category, "Behind The Scenes" emerged as the highest-grossing title, while FilmOne Entertainment was named the year's top-grossing

distributor. Other category leaders included "Zootopia 2" as the highest-grossing animation, "Sinners" as the highest-grossing Hollywood release, and "Demon Slayer: Kimetsu no Yaiba – The Movie: Infinity Castle" as the top-grossing anime.

Nollywood films accounted for 49.4% of the total market share, closely followed by Hollywood releases with

48.8%, while films from China and Liberia contributed 1.2%. In terms of volume, 81 Nollywood films, 92 Hollywood titles, and 52 Indian productions were screened during the year, reflecting the diverse content available to audiences.

The figures highlight a growing cinema culture in West Africa and an increasing appetite for both local and international storytelling.

'My Father Has Been a Burden,' Portable Alleges

"My dad's presence in my life is doing me more harm than good. My life was better and more stable when he wasn't in the picture," Portable said. He added, "When I was younger, he didn't take care of me. He did not send me to school. He did not pay for my tailoring apprenticeship fee. His presence is affecting my life negatively. My dad is like Mohbad's dad. He has taken all my shoes and clothes, and he is just after my properties." The singer's remarks have sparked conversations on social media about family responsibility and parental support in Nigeria's entertainment industry.

Regina Daniels Threatens Legal Action Against Ned Nwoko

Actress Regina Daniels has threatened to take legal action against her estranged husband, Senator



Ned Nwoko, and others over allegations that she was involved in hard drug use. In a video shared on her Instagram page on Wednesday, Daniels presented laboratory test results from a California hospital, which showed that she tested negative for all hard drugs. The results indicated that the only substance associated with her was ecstasy (molly). Speaking in the video, the actress said the accusations were damaging attempts to tarnish her reputation. "It's a new year, and with it came a moment of clarity. I realised there are certain narratives I can no longer allow to linger over my name as a public figure," Daniels stated. She continued, "I was never on any hard drugs or any nonsense fabricated online. I will sue, I will definitely sue at the appropriate time. Honestly speaking, the only drug I was associated with was ecstasy." Daniels emphasized that her action is not only to defend her reputation but also to protect her children. "The only reason I took this test is to give a strong, confident voice to those who believe in me, and above all, to give my children something priceless—pride—so that when they grow up, they will know that their mother was never a drug addict," she said. The clarification comes nearly three months after Senator Ned Nwoko publicly accused her of drug use, sparking widespread media attention and social media discussions.

Lagos court to judge 31-yr-old man for stealing car part

A 31-year-old man, Abubakar Saidu, has been remanded in prison custody after pleading guilty to stealing motor parts in Lagos. Saidu was arraigned at the Ikorodu Magistrate Court where the magistrate, Adedeji Ogbe, found him guilty of the crime following his arraignment by the police. The Police Prosecutor,

Adegeshin Famuyiwa, mentioned that Saidu, who is facing a two-count charge of illegal entry and theft, stole a vehicle starter worth N40,000 on January 4, in Owode area of Ikorodu, thereby, contravening the laws of the state. At the proceeding on Thursday, Famuyiwa said that the suspect, alongside other at large, jumped into the premises of one Ovin's Company and

committed the offence. She added that individuals in the area held the

accused and handed him over to the police, leading to his trial at the court.

The police official stated that the transgression violate the provisions of Section 287 of the Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2015.

Ogbe, having listened to the guilty plea made by Saidu ordered his remand pending his next re-arraignment on January 15 for review of facts and sentencing.



Police Arraign Two Suspects For Stealing Motorbikes

The police in Lagos have arraigned two suspects, Rasaki Adeniran and Olaoluwa Akingboju, in court on allegations of theft of two motorcycles in Ikorodu. Famuyiwa added that the suspects connived with others at large to steal the items and also carted away with another on the same day valued at N1.2 million with registration number FKJ 583QN, all acts contrary to Sections 287, 410 and 411 of the Criminal Laws of Lagos State, 2015. The Presiding Magistrate, Adedeji Ogbe, granted the accused persons bail in the sum of N500,000 each, with two sureties in like sum and adjourned the case till January 22.

Man Faces Trial Over Alleged Theft of 103 Cement Bags

Court Jails 35yr Old Man For Drug Trafficking

The Federal High Court in Lagos has sentenced a 35-year-old man, Deji Adesanya, to jail for contravening the state's law through illicit drug trafficking. The court found Adesanya culpable after he pleaded guilty to peddling five kilograms of cannabis sativa, otherwise known as marijuana, after which he was sentenced to a six-month prison sentence over the crime.

The convict was arrested by the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency, NDLEA, and arraigned over charges of dealing in the prohibited substance, an offence under the body's act. NDLEA prosecutor, Peter Ekuri, told the Presiding Judge, Akintayo Aluko, that the convict was nabbed on November 22 in Ikate-Elegushi area of the state, after which he reviewed the facts

of the case and tendered several exhibits as evidence against the lawbreaker. Ekuri submitted that the offence is contrary to and punishable under Section 11(c) of the

National Drug Enforcement Agency Act, Cap N30, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria 2004. At the trial held yesterday, the prosecutor prayed the court to sentence

Adesanya accordingly, however, defence counsel, Rita Nyiew, urged for leniency in the judgement. Nyiew asked the judge to consider her client's early guilty plea and

remorse, as well as his promise to refrain from further deals in criminal activity. Aluko consequently sentenced the litigant to six month sentence with an option of fine of N450,000.
