

## LG Autonomy: Jubilation, **Uncertainty Trail Verdict**




t has been jubilation galore among local government workers across Lagos State since the Supreme Court granted financial autonomy to the councils a few days ago. However, many of the local government chairmen have refused to make comments on the new development. When o u r correspondent called a few of them, they declined and said they would not talk until the state governor, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-Olu has reacted to the issue. Prior to the Thursday judgment, Sanwo-Olu had faulted the Federal Government's suit for including Lagos state among the 36 states. He said that Lagos had been complying with the federal constitution and that the The Attorney General of the Federation, Lateef Fagbemi should have done due diligence to identify the states that are not in compliance.

The Supreme Court granted granted financial autonomy to local governments in the country over federal government allocations on Thursday, ruling against their dependence on state governors to access funds.

The court declared that local governments dependence on governors to get funds after a disbursement by the federal government is a trample on the rights of the third-tier level of government.

The autonomy was granted in a verdict by Justice Emmanuel

Agim at the court in Abuja following a petition by the local governments in the country in a suit initiated by the Attorney General of the Federation, AGF, Lateef Fagbemi.

The suit sought the safeguarding the rights of the third-tier level of government in accordance with the 1999 Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria.

Agbim, delivering the judgement, said that henceforth, the local government should independently get allocations from the federal government without the overseeing by the state governors.

The ruling also restrains the executive arm from any form of unilateral, arbitrary, and unlawful dissolving of all 774 democratically elected local government chairmen from their respective councils.

Reacting, the Secretary to Ejigbo Local Council Development Area, Mr. Paul Fregene described the Supreme Court verdict as a victory for democracy, which should be celebrated for clear distinct true federalism.

As he put it, "The autonomy of the local government grows beyond allocation of funds. It's now a council that is accountable for his leadership to the electorate. It's just like a fresh graduate who completes his NYSC, he/she is now free to take decision independently less interference."

He said, "In Ejigbo LCDA, we are excited on the judgement and we are fully ready to integrate into the enormous responsibility attached therein. The Executive Chairman, Hon Monsuru Oloyede Bello OBE is knowledgeable and competent to harness the potential to drive infrastructural development. Ejigbo LCDA new secretariat is a testimony that we are ready to hit the ground running as per the supreme Court judgement."

However, officials at Oshodi/Isolo Local Government Area, Mushin, Ikeja and Agege Local Government Areas refused to comment. They told Echonews that their chairmen had instructed them not to speak until the governor had made a fresh statement on the issue. To the National Comrade Ayodele President of the Association of Local Government of Nigeria, ALGON, Aminu some kinds of Lagos has been enjoying this financial transaction before the supreme court judgment of Thursday. He described the verdict as a welcome development and most especially to the grassroots people. " People are so happy

about t h e pronouncement. have to follow this strictly to allow local government to breath. Most of the chairmen we have now are highly educated. The autonomy will go a long way in improving the lives of the grassroots people. We need serious check and balances. We have been talking to ourselves since Thursday because the expectations of Nigerians from us now are high, "he stated.

To the former Chairman of Amuwo-Odofin Local Government Area, Adewale, local government in Lagos have been enjoying autonomy before now but with the Supreme Court verdict, things will change for the better.

He said that the fullness of the autonomy is when the necessary amendment is made by the National Assembly and enshrined in the constitution.

To him, it is not really the amount of money moved into the local government that will move the system forward but the capacity of the local

authority themselves to use it judiciously for the gains of the grassroots people.

"The development of the local government is to transform the capacity itself They must be able to turn it around for the betterment of their people. The stream of funds is clearly defined and with the court ruling, no governor can incapacitate the local government chairmen," he stated.

Adewale explained that by the supreme court ruling, it will help to showcase the enormity of power as it will create multiple of structures and allows local government to expand its revenue generation. However, he pointed out a gap in the constitution, section 197 of the federal constitution, which allows state to create local government areas, positing that ggovernors will need to sponsor a bill to address the discrepancy.

To him, the issue of Joint account and other laws can be reviewed from time to time. Prior to 1999, local government got money directly from the federation account. He called on the people at the grassroots to begin monitor the fund that will soon be sending directly to the local government and match it with budgetary provision. "At this junction, I will call for Local Government police and its own electoral commission to make it more autonomous. a lot of local governments have not been active. They don't hold consultative meetings, town Hall meetings. People must be begin to Interact with the local government.

Speaking the former President of the National Union of Local Government Employees, NULGE Comrade Deji Akinwalere said he was so elated that what he fought for many years had become a reality in his life time.

According to him, the best way for citizens to enjoy democracy is by moving governance closer to them but local government h a d been incapacitated for so many years, making it difficult for people to experience democracy.

"If democracy cannot be at local

government where else should it start. The supreme court judgment has decolonised local government. Governors over the years used their powers to prevent bill for local government autonomy. There is no immunity for chairmen like governors and president, which means people can prosecute them," he said.

He noted that though some governors might want to compromise the supreme court verdict by asking the local government chairmen to produce what they had gotten from the federal account, " We have our fears but then we will be monitoring things."

Akinwalere said that the judgment would make responsible people to come and serve. "Corruption will be minimised.

Opportunity for development and for Civil Society Organisations to ask questions will open up. People will demand accountability through Freedom of information bill", he said.

Reacting, a human right lawyer, Laorous Oshoma, said the judgment had come with a cloud of skepticism and poses the question of legitimacy on the leadership of the local council, which will eventually be elected by the state electoral body. "If we must have real autonomy, I think local government need their own electoral body to make it more autonomous. Implementation of the supreme court verdict matters. Funds should not be given to those who a r e n o t democratically

elected at local govt level. Past elections have shown that state governments are incapable of conducting local government election. INEC is even better but at local government level, things are worse. The election of the chairmen and councillors is important to us," he said.

Quoting Sections 197, 162, section 2, Section 7 of the federal constitution, Oshoma said that only section 7 gives functions of the local government. ""There is need to take a look at the constitution again so that the duties of the local government will be spelt out.

In his own analysis of the judgment, former chairman Nigeria's National Human Rights Commission, professor said the judgment is a little complex because there are still issues about the process of electioneering and how the leaders of the local governments are brought to seats.

"The Legitimacy of those who are in power to access the money is an issue because if they are not properly elected, the direct fund from the federal account will go back to the corrupt people. How best to look after the interest of our people matters and that is why the judgment stands between Legitimacy and jurisprudence. I'm not excited by the verdict,"" he said.

According to him, if the chairmen are lawfully elected, then one may say that the money from the federal being given to them will be judiciously used, otherwise, there will be nothing to show for the new system.

Meanwhile, the Lagos State House of Assembly has invited the Attorney-General of the State, Mr. Lawal Pedro, to appear before it to explain the Supreme Court judgement on local governments in the country.

The lawmakers said there was a need for better understanding of the decision of the apex court in relation to some provisions in the Constitution of the country.

Ruling after a voice vote by lawmakers at plenary on Thursday, the Speaker of the Assembly, Rt. Hon. Mudashiru Obasa, ruled: "There is a need for us to seek clarification and understanding of this judgement. It will be good to invite the Attorney-General to brief us and give his understanding so that we do not run foul of the judgement."



## Health Insurance: LASHMA Partners LASRRA To Simplify Enrolment of Ilera Eko

Permanent Secretary of LASHMA, Dr. Emmanuella Zamba disclosed this today during a joint media briefing with LASRRA at the Folarin Coker Staff Clinic in Alausa, Ikeja. Dr. Zamba explained that the partnership aims to ensure that more residents are enrolled in the ILERA EKO health insurance scheme, as anyone who registers with LASRRA will be automatically captured in the ILERA EKO Health Scheme.

"Our partnership with LASRRA marks the beginning of another journey. We expect this collaboration to increase awareness, registration, and utilisation of healthcare services covered by ILERA EKO. We have trained LASRRA staff and will continue to do so to achieve our desired goals", Dr. Zambasaid.

The Permanent Secretary further emphasised that the partnership is a significant step toward providing a wide range of healthcare services to residents, aligning with the health and environment mandate of the THEMES Plus agenda of the current administration.

She listed LASHMA's three arms as the ILERA



EKO Social Health Insurance Scheme; the Regulations arm responsible for ensuring that residents in both formal and informal sectors enrol in the scheme, and the EKO Social Health Alliance (EKOSHA), a resource mobilisation arm catering to the vulnerable and indigent populations.

"The Lagos State Health Management Agency has been working relentlessly since its full operations commenced in 2021 to ensure that residents enrol in the Lagos State Health Insurance Scheme. To date, the agency has about 1,064,897 enrollees in its database", Dr. Zamba added.

Reiterating the administration's commitment to achieving universal healthcare coverage,

Dr. Zamba mentioned that LASHMA has established five divisional offices, 14 sub-divisional offices, and 16 kiosks across the state to reach all corners. She urged all residents to register with the ILERA EKO health insurance scheme or LASRRA to enjoy quality and efficient health care services.

"I implore every resident who has not yet registered with LASRRA to do so imm ediately. Registration not only serves as evidence of residency but also provides access to numerous benefits offered by the State", Dr. Zamba stated.

Speaking in the same vein, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Innovation, Science, and Technology, Engr.

Ibilola Kasunmu highlighted the introduction of a unique identification card; the Lagos ID card, designed to streamline access to various services, ensuring no resident is left behind.

"We recognise that carrying multiple cards can be cumbersome. Lagos ID, the unique identification card for Lagos residents is a significant milestone, serving as both identification and access to a multitude of government services. The Lagos ID card, featuring 28 applets, is designed to streamline service access", Engr. Kasunmu explained.

Speaking on the partnership, the General Manager of LASRRA, Mrs. Bilikiss Adebiyi-Abiola noted that registering with LASRRA provides a gateway to various state services, including

health, educational support, housing initiatives, social welfare programs, business development opportunities, and transport services.

"The essence of being here today is to underscore the critical importance of registering with LASRRA which serves as the gateway to essential services provided by the Lagos State Government. I want to specifically emphasise two key benefits that registration with LASRRA affords: access to the Lagos State Health Insurance Scheme and seamless access to a plethora of Lagos State services", Mrs. Adebiyi-Abiola stated.

She elaborated that, through LASRRA registration, residents gain effortless access to the Lagos State Health

Scheme managed by LASHMA. This health insurance scheme is designed to ensure that every resident of Lagos State can access quality healthcare services without financial constraints. By registering with LASRRA, individuals and families become eligible for its coverage, providing them with peace of mind knowing that their healthcare needs are covered.

Mrs. Adebiyi-Abiola also highlighted the seamless registration process, noting that it can be done both online and offline, with biometric capturing at any of the 62 registration outlets across the state. She encouraged residents to register and pick up their Lagos ID cards, emphasising the importance of being part of the state's development plans.





The Permanent Secretary said that all housing construction and provision of infrastructure facilities in the State are funded by tax payer's money, adding that beneficiaries of these projects must have evidence of personal income tax.

Warning that the Ministry will not process any application that does not include the aforementioned documents, he enjoined the citizenry to take full advantage of the opportunities offered by the State Government in prioritising the completion of all ongoing housing projects to reduce the housing deficit in the State and the Nation at large.

## Tailor In Court Over Manslaughter

he Ikeja Magistrates' Court has held a tailor for prosecution following his alleged involvement in the death of man identified as Usman Hamed.

The Lagos State Police Command arraigned the suspect, an hausa man identified as Usman Shaba, on Thursday, before Justice Oyindamola Ogala on one count of manslaughter.

The prosecution stated that the alleged offender, on February 20, 2023, at about 7:30am at Number 12, Odusanya Street in Agege, pummeled the deceased, shoving and pressing his body to the ground severally till he passed on.

The defendant, 44, having allegely committed the act, contravened Section

224 of the Criminal Law, page 617, volume 3, of the Laws of Lagos State 2015.

The court had the charges translated from English into Hausa to ensure that the defendant understood

The defendant pleaded not guilty to the charge The case was then adjourned to October 7 for further hearing.



### Court Jails Guard Raping Neighbour's Daughter

ustice Abiola Sholadoye has sent a 72-year-old man to jail for raping, defiling his neighbours daughter.

The septuagenarian, David Jackson, was arraigned on Monday at the Lagos State Special Offences Court, Ikeja, where he was sentenced to life imprisonment.

In her rulling, Justice Sholadoye said that the proof submitted by the prosecution provides strong evidences to affirm that the victim did not only rape the minor but also defiled her.

Prosecutor, Abimbola Abolade, stated that convict worked as a security guard in one of the houses at Oyedele Street, Ojodu Berger, Lagos, where the survivor lives with her parents.

During the trial, Abolade called on three witnesses who testified of the crime. The suspect also pleaded guilty.

The prosecuting counsel also stated that the the convict committed the offence on May 16, 2022,

The judge, ordering that name of the jailer should be registered in the Lagos State Offences Register said, "The facts of the case were that a brother of the survivor sent her on an errand on the day of the incident and when she passed and greeted the defendant, Jackson, he dragged her inside the room and when she shouted, he used his handkerchief to cover her mouth.



"The testimony of the survivor was clear, consistent and coherent under crossexamination.

"The second prosecution witness was a teacher who identified that the survivor was her student and she testified that one of her classmate had reported to her that the survivor was not feeling well and she was walking in a funny way.

"The teacher, in her evidence, said she made an inquiry and discovered that the survivor was complaining of pains on her private part and that someone had sexually assaulted her."

She continued, "The teacher invited the parents of the survivor but they did not come around, hence she reported the case and the survivor was referred to the Mirabel Medical Centre in Ikeja and the medical report from the center was forwarded to the

"The survivor's father's credible testimony credible also corroborated with the evidence of the other two prosecution witnesses.

"The father identified the defendant as a security guard around his neighborhood and said he was with his wife, who was ill in the hospital when the incident happened.

"The testimonies of the prosecution witnesses were credible, convincing, compelling and the prosecution proved the case of defendant.

"First, the survivor was a child as she came to the court to testify, secondly, the defendant had sexual intercourse with her and there was no consent as the survivor is a minor.

"The defendant is consequently found guilty as charged for defilement of a 7-year old child contrary to Section 137 of the Criminal Laws of Lagos state 2015 and he is hereby sentenced to life imprisonment."

### Man, Son Remanded For Stealing Firm's N75m

company has logged complain against a father and son over an alleged theft of the sum of N75,000,000.

The father, Babatunde Ishola, alongside his son, Bayo Ishola, were remanded at the Kirikiri Correctional Centre over the alleged act.

At the Yaba Magistrates' Court, an extract from the charge against the duo who were said to have stolen the sum from a Lotto company reads, " "That you, Ishola Mubarak Babatunde, Ishola defilement against the Rasheed Bayo, and others now at large, between 2020 and 2023, at Lotgrand Limited, a registered lotto company in Lagos, within the Magisterial District of this Honourable Court, conspired amongst yourselves to commit felony to wit stealing. You thereby committed an offence punishable under Section 411 of the Criminal Law of Lagos State 2015."



The suspects arraigned on two counts of stealing and diversion of funds were alleged to have taken money from the company's account and diverted it to their accounts and those of their accomplices who are now at large.

The police prosecutor, Mike Enejere, told the court that first defendant, Babatunde, was a worker with the company as an account officer from 2020 till 2023.

The Magistrate, Mojisola Salau, adjourned the case till September 3, 2024.

Prior to the adjoining, Salau put the duo on a N10m bail grant. She held that they get remanded at the correctional centre pending the perfection of the bail conditions.







during the talk, Mr. Olorunfemi urged residents to maintain a healthy environment because the risk of a cholera outbreak is higher in a dirty environment; wash hands after using the toilet; avoid buying fruits and foods, particularly from

roadside vendors; stop open defecation; avoid indiscriminate dumping of refuse; and ensure proper water sanitation, among other precautions.

He highlighted some of the symptoms of cholera, including watery diarrhoea,

vomiting, fever, dehydration, and rapid heartbeat. Mr. Olorunfemi recommended anyone experiencing these symptoms to get medical attention as soon as possible, since delaying treatment could be deadly.
