Afrobeats Sing Louder Despite Grammy Losses

igerian singers have taken Afrobeats so high that many foreign artists now seek collaboration with them. Rema's Calm Down with American Selena Gomez won many awards. Chris Brown's duet with Davido in "Blow my mind". Wizkid with Chris Brown's "Call me everyday" and Wizkid featuring in Beyonce's Brown skin girl are just a few of the duets with Afrobeats stars.

The 66th Grammy let many fans of Nigerian Afrobeats singers down as none of the 10 nominees won any award at the event held at Peacock Theatre in Los Angeles, California last weekend.

The nominees were Burna Boy, Davido, Olamide, Asake, Ayra Starr who contested for 10 categories but none of them won as the South Africa's Tyla clinched the Best African Music Performance award with her song "Water".

Even though the award had been generating a lot of debates among music lovers, it however created a kind of solace for Afrobeats in the music world.

It began with the dazzling of Burna Boy who made history with his performance at the Grammy Awards for the first time, becoming the first Afro-fusion artiste to do soo.

Though Burna is largely associated with the more widely known genre of Afrobeats — which itself is often a fusion of genres such as highlife, hiphop, R&B, and more — he has long attempted to differentiate himself by referring to his own music as Afrofusion. Other artistes like Ghanaian singer Amaarae, have categorized their music as Afro-fusion as well.

Trevor Noah, the South African host of the night, joked before fellow African Burna Boy took the stage.

"You know people say Afrobeats is new and personally growing up in South Africa, I would get Afrobeats all the time for my mom every time I came home past my curfew," he chided before welcoming the Grammy winning sensation from Nigeria.

In his performance, Burna Boy brought out energetic dancers and a backing band decked all out in green, a seeming nod to the Nigerian flag. Sporting a red rhinestone-adorned quilted jacket with matching gray pants and a snapback, Burna was all smiles and swagger as he brought his culture to the Grammys stage.

Burna moved to the more modern song "City Boys" before dazzling the audience with "Sittin' On Top of the World" and bringing out Brandi, whose 1998 hit "Top of the World" with Ma\$e is sampled in the song.

Burna Boy and Tiwa Savage combined with Brandy who hasn't graced the stage since the Nineties to deliver smooth vocals. Dressed in a black trench coat and large clear glasses, complete with stunning scarlet boots to mark that she and Burna are indeed on top of the world.

21 Savage, who was featured in the remix of "Sittin' On Top of the World" with Burna Boy, came out in an all-red fit to rap his verse. The onstage collaboration marks 21 Savage's Grammy performance debut

Reacting to Nigerian singers not winning despite their escapades across the world recently, multiple Grammy award winner, Drake Consoles the nominees.

In his message to Davido, Burna Boy, Olamide the popular musician, Drake said the fact that they have their songs being listened to by people is a win and shouldn't allow not winning a Grammy be a problem to them.

To popular American rapper Jay Z, the Grammys has its shortcomings in recognizing Black artists. He highlighted the inconsistencies in the Grammy selection process, emphasizing that even by their own metrics, the system falls short.

Jay-Z referenced his wife, Beyoncé, who boasts an impressive collection of Grammy Awards.

However, despite her numerous accolades, including the most Grammys won by any female artist, she has never won the coveted 'Album of the Year' honour. Jay expressed his opinion by saying, "Even by your own metrics, it doesn't work."

The rapper urged the Recording Academy to rectify this oversight, urging them to "get it right" or at least "get it close to right." His words represented countless artists who have felt overlooked or underrepresented within the Grammy framework.

Jay-Z also talked about how the Grammy Awards are subjective. He said, "It's music, and it's opinion-based." While artistic evaluations involve personal preferences, he urged the Academy to be fair and transparent, especially when celebrating Black excellence.

To Lagos State Governor, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-Olu, the Nigerian nominees should not feel disheartened for not winning any of the awards.

Sanwo-Olu in a post on his official X, wrote: "A special shoutout to @davido, @burnaboy, @ayrastarr, @asakemusik, @Olamide and @temsbaby and all Nigerian talents represented as nominees at the Grammy's, the apex music award in the world.

"Your mastery reached unparalleled heights on those exclusive platforms, showcasing world class talent we are immensely proud of.

"To those who may feel disheartened by the results, remember, in the eyes of your fans and Nigerians, you are everlasting winners and with every global arena and stadiums you fill up, your representation of Afrobeats and Nigeria is unparalleled, and soon you will light up the stages you desire as triumphant victors.

"Cheers to more timeless moments as you continue to tell the world our stories with your music."

The hashtag #GrammySnubNaija trended on X, formerly Twitter, with fans venting their frustration over what they perceived as a missed opportunity for Nigerian music to gain international recognition.

The Twitterverse became a virtual town square for fans to voice their disappointment, frustration, and disbelief.

@NaijaMusicLover tweeted, "I can't believe what I just witnessed. All our hopes were dashed in one night. Davido and Burna Boy deserved better."

X user @AfrobeatsQueen shared a meme of a shocked face, captioned, "Me watching the Grammys realising they snubbed our Nigerian kings. #ShameOnGrammys."

@NaijaJollofQueen wrote, "This is beyond heartbreaking. Our artistes have been making waves globally, and the Grammys failed to acknowledge their impact. Disappointed but not defeated. We'll keep shining.

In a series of passionate tweets, @MusicAficionado expressed, "It's not just about winning awards. Nigerian music has influenced the world. Our artists have elevated the game. Grammy or not, we are a force to be reckoned with.

#NaijaStandUp."

Celebrities also joined the conversation, stating, "Sending love and respect to our stars who gave their all. We see your hard work and dedication. The Grammys might have missed it, but the world knows who runs the show. #NaijaToTheWorld," they said.

Despite the disappointment, some X users emphasised the need to focus on the bigger picture.

@AfrobeatInsider tweeted, "Let's not forget Nigerian music's impact globally. Awards are just one part of the journey. Our artistes have opened doors for Afrobeats worldwide. The movement continues."

Meanwhile, President Bola Tinubu has congratulated the six Nigeria's musical talents nominated for the 2024 Grammy Awards: Burna Boy, Davido, Olamide, Tems, Asake, and Ayra Starr.

This is contained in a statement issued by presidential spokesman, Ajuri Ngelale.

According to Ngelale, "President Tinubu celebrates these musical marvels who have put Nigeria on the chart of cultural command through their artistry and anthemic earworms, building and earning our nation enormous soft power.

"The President commends these exceptional artists for their fidelity to the art, audacity, and discipline in the pursuit of excellence."

"Our superstars nominated for the Grammy Awards are all winners. I am proud of their exploits. They represent that Nigerian ideal; the courage to strive and succeed against all odds and the hope to stay true to purpose. I congratulate and thank them for being exemplary envoys of Nigeria," the President was quoted as saying. Isreal DMW names Davido the best despite Grammy loss.

However the chief executive of Grammy awards, Harvey Mason Jr has given criteria to win Grammy Award.

He said no one wins Grammy based on his or her fans, streams or followers. According to him, the awards are given based on merits.

Harvey Mason stated in a video sighted online that people don't win Grammys based on the number of fans they have, the streams they have, or the sales they make.

He says the artist wins awards based on membership of the artists of the Recording Academy and the votes the artists get from the members of the academy.

"Also, members of the recording academy take your works and listen to your songs based on the quality and









LAGOS Taskforce Clamps Down on Okada Operations Along Lagos-Badagry **Expressway**



n a move to ensure public safety and uphold the laid down traffic rules and regulations on the State's Highways, Bridges and other restricted routes, the Lagos State Taskforce has intensified its operations along the Lagos-Badagry Expressway, resulting in the seizure of 497 motorcycles popularly known as Okada

The recent operations led by the Chairman of the Agency, CSP Shola Jejeloye, also covered areas such as Doyin Bus Stop, Alakija, Iyana Iba, Igbo-Elerin, Festac Link Bridge and Igando to stamp the commitment of the Lagos State Task Force to enforce traffic regulations and maintain order and sanity on Lagos Roads. These efforts are part of a broader initiative to enhance safety for all road users and eliminate the risks associated with okada operations on restricted routes and highways.

The Chairman described the activities of okada operators, especially along the Lagos-Badagry Expressway, as reckless due to the nonchalant attitude of the operators on the corridor.

"Okada operators here are the cause of major accidents and a big threat to the security architecture of the State along this route, especially the ones you see facing oncoming vehicles directly on one way. It is complete madness and I recommend anyone caught in the act be subjected to psychiatric evaluation", Jejeloye stated.

Utilising tactical superiority, the Taskforce achieved a remarkable record of seizures during the operation, signalling a clear message to okada violators that enforcement measures will be rigorously implemented in all nooks and crannies of the State.

The Chairman reiterated the importance of compliance with traffic regulations and warned erring riders to desist from their operations along restricted routes immediately. Failure to adhere to these regulations will result in the impoundment of motorcycles and possible jail term.

Going forward, the Lagos State Task Force affirms its commitment to making these operations a continuous endeavour until all restricted routes and highways are free from the menace of Okada. The Lagos State Task Force, therefore, solicited the cooperation of all stakeholders, including riders and members of the public, in achieving this goal and ensuring the safety and orderliness of all.

He assured Lagosians that the tactical superiority of the Agency would suppress any form of manoeuvring ability of okada riders, reminding them that both rider and passenger are culpable in the event of an arrest while plying restricted routes.

It will encourage parents of children with disabilities to see the possibilities of getting their children educated thereby improving their lives".

General Manager added that a lot needs to be done to create awareness amongst other students as well as the lecturers to provide a wellequipped resource centre where students with disabilities can participate without hindrances thereby exploring their potential.

"You need a wellcentre for your students; Braille, Jusenabled laptops for students with visual impairments, sign language instructors for those with hearing impairments, magnifying glasses for those with albinism, ramps, rails and other tools for the physically challenged", she reiterated.

She said that the Director, Medical Aids, Agency remains committed to the advancement of the cause of Persons with Disability and will be willing to refer, support and partner with Lagos

State University in this regard.

Earlier, Ms. Arojojoye, the leader of the visiting team, said the Lagos State University is looking to upgrade the Disability Support Unit of the Institution and needs the input and support of the Lagos State Office for Disability Office Affairs. She said LASU has put in place a Disability Support Unit to cater equipped resource for the needs of students with disabilities in the institution.

Odunuga-Bakare Calls For Robust Real Estate Regulation

he Special Adviser to Mr. Governor on Housing, Barr. Barakat Odunuga-Bakare has emphasised the significance of robust real estate regulations in the State, expressing optimism that the #Greater Lagos Rising mantra of Governor Babajide Sanwo-Olu is achievable through collaborative efforts and adherence to regulatory

standards.

She stated this while delivering her keynote address at the Real Estate Outlook 2024 event organised by the Nigerian-British Chamber of Commerce (NBCC), themed "Looking Ahead, Gauging Opportunities", aimed at providing a platform for stakeholders to explore prospects in the real estate sector held on Monday via Zoom.

While emphasising the pivotal role of regulatory measures in fostering a conducive environment for real estate development in Lagos State, the Special Adviser stated that Real Estate regulation must be transparent to achieve sustainable growth within the real estate industry.

Underlining the commitment of the Lagos State Government to prioritise the housing sector as part of its agenda to propel the state into a 21st-century economy, Odunuga-Bakare highlighted the implementation of the Affordable Home Ownership Scheme, underscoring the importance of real estate regulation within the sector.

In her presentation, she informed the gathering about the establishment of the Lagos State Real Estate Regulatory Authority (LASRERA), a regulatory agency tasked with overseeing the activities of individuals and organisations operating in the real estate sector.

Odunuga-Bakare outlined LASRERA's mandate, which includes issuing and renewing permit licences, investigating complaints, eliminating unethical practices, and conducting training for industry professionals.

She lauded the collaborative efforts between LASRERA and federal enforcement agencies, stressing the imperative of restoring confidence and trust among local and international investors by combating fraudulent practices effectively.

Furthermore, she stressed the importance of ensuring that only qualified professionals operate within the industry to safeguard the interests of buyers and

She urged real estate practitioners to comply with the provisions of the State Real Estate Law and advised investors to verify LASRERA permits before engaging in property transactions.

She said, "As a Ministry, we had made concerted efforts to curb all forms of abuses among women by establishing a call tollfree line 767, also known as the Purple project, to enable victims of Sexual and Gender-Based Violence reach out to the Ministry immediately this act is perpetrated for quick responses. Referrals are made by the Ministry to other MDAs – the Ministry of Health, Justice – to ensure that victims get fair justice all the time".

She noted that the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers, themed "Action for Peace; Our Ambition for Global Goal", is a clarion call for everyone to come together and actively work towards a more peaceful and equitable world, adding that all over the world there is an urgent call for peace and this can only be achieved by the collaborative efforts of Men, Women, Youth and everyone

The Commissioner admonished security agencies and paramilitary organisations such as the Nigeria Army, Navy, Air force, Police, Customs and Immigration among

others at the session to share ideas with representatives from all the Local Governments and Local Council Development Areas on the need, and how to involve women and youths in the process of building and sustaining peace in the society.

Similarly, Mrs. Saheed Adebambo, Deputy Director, Social welfare and Head of Adoption, Ministry of Youth and Social Development called on all stakeholders to be proactive in responding to cases of gender violence, just as she charged stakeholders to collaborate in the fight to reduce abuses in the

While speaking on best practices in nabbing perpetrators of SGBV, Mrs. Olawumi Oluwatoyin Evans-Emmanuel, Assistant Commandant of Corps, National Security, Civil Defense Corps, said that Gender-Based Violence is a criminal act and prosecutors of such act should be punished not as civil offenders.

She intimated participants to cascade the information shared at the event to other officers, even as she requested that victims of

Sexual and Gender-Based Violence should be encouraged to speak out to get their issues addressed immediately by the security officials in the State.

In his address, Mr. Idris Ibrahim, Head of WAPA Contact Centre, LASEMA, stated that Domestic Violence call centres are the first point of call for survivors and as such Head of Departments in the Ministry of Women Affairs and Poverty Alleviation situated in 57 Local Governments and Local Council Development Areas should support the initiative to ensure that callers get the appropriate respond to their complaints.

The highlight of the event was the presentation by the Commissioner for WAPA, Hon. Cecilia Bolaji Dada to the outstanding officers from the Domestic Violence contact centre, namely Mr. Solomon Famolu, Family Social Services, Alimosho and Mrs. Olatoun Akingboye, Surulere as well as Mrs. Shukurat Arigbabu, Head of Department, Women Affairs and Poverty Alleviation, Oshodi/Isolo Local Government.

She underscored the transformative potential of new trends in pharmacy, including digital health technologies and epharmacy solutions, in enhancing healthcare access, particularly in remote areas. Dr. Ogunyemi noted the importance of pharmacists in providing essential medicines and services, regardless of individuals' social or economic status.

Furthermore, the Special Adviser emphasised the evolving role of pharmacists



in promoting preventive and holistic healthcare approaches, urging collaboration with other healthcare providers and community engagement to empower individuals and communities.

Dr. Ogunyemi, therefore, urged stakeholders to embrace new trends, emphasising the commitment of the Lagos State Government to achieving universal health coverage through its THEMES Plus agenda with a focus on health and the environment.

Speaking in the same vein, the Permanent Secretary of Lagos State Ministry of Health, Dr. Olusegun Ogboye also advocated collaboration and tighter regulations in the pharmacy sector, emphasising the need for local solutions and tighter regulations to address challenges facing the pharmacy sector.

economies of scale to keep prices low.

He, however, noted that challenges have arisen, including the majority of stock in hospitals being sourced independently, leading to concerns about a uthenticity and undermining the system's integrity.

Moreover, Dr. Ogboye a d d r e s s e d i s s u e s surrounding prescription practices, emphasising the importance of adherence to the essential drug list and discouraging the arbitrary prescription of medications not stocked by the hospital. He called for hospitals to become one-stop shops to eliminate the need for p a t i e n t s t o s e e k medications elsewhere.

In addition, Dr. Ogboye emphasised the need for enhanced monitoring and enforcement to combat the proliferation of fake drugs and unlicense depharmacies. He urged pharmacists to play an active role in regulation, stressing that the State Government has rejigged efforts to address these challenges effectively.

Speaking on the lingering issue of consultant pharmacists, Dr. Ogboye expressed hope for a resolution through continued engagement between leadership and stakeholders. Dr. Ogboye encouraged open and frank discussions amongst stakeholders and participants to generate meaningful outcomes that would enhance the work of pharmacists in Lagos State. In his goodwill message, the Permanent Secretary, Lagos State Primary Health Care Board, Dr. Ibrahim Mustafa, who was represented by the Director of Pharmaceutical Services at the Board, Pharm. Shakirat Adeosun underscored the pivotal role of pharmaceutical services in primary healthcare delivery. Celebrating the

achievements of the Board, particularly in implementing the Sustainable Drug Revolving Scheme (SDRF) across numerous Primary Health Care Centres (PHCs) in Lagos State, Dr. Mustafa restated the commitment of the board to equitable

healthcare access and quality medicine provision for all residents.

Earlier, Director of Pharmaceutical Services at the Lagos State Ministry of Health, Pharm. Oyebisi Omolambe highlighted the importance of the summit as a platform for meaningful engagement, idea exchange, and networking. She emphasised the significance of collaboration, learning, and growth in addressing pressing issues and seizing new opportunities in the pharmacy profession.

Furthermore, Pharm. Omolambe underscored the alignment of the summit's objectives with the T.H.E.M.E.S Plus agenda of Governor Babajide Sanwo-Olu, noting the shared commitment to achieving universal health coverage through innovative pharmacy practices.

Encouraging active participation and fruitful dialogue, Pharm. Omolambe urged attendees to leverage their collective expertise to inspire change and make a lasting impact in the pharmacy sector.





he Lagos State House of Assembly has mourned the demise of late Chief Executive Officer of Access Bank, Herbert Wigwe, urging his colleagues to emulate his footprints and sustain his legacy.

Wigwe's passing came in a helicopter crash in the United States of America alongside his wife, Doreen, son and Abimbola Ogunbajo, a former chairman of Nigeria Exchange Group.

Speaking under a plenary tagged 'Matter of Urgent Public Importance', Speaker of the House, Mudashiru Obasa, described Wigwe's demise as "shocking, painful, disturbing and unexpected."

Obasa who called for a stand-up minute silence for the deceased recalled the late banking tycoon as a highly passionate individual who was engrossed with Nigeria's development.

He said that Wigwe was a creature who struggled to establish himself in terms of professionalism, his contributions and activities in the banking industry and even his personal life.

He recalled the banker as a patron of the Lagos City Marathon which he supported for many years.

Obasa, who said that Wigwe was concerned about the economy of the nation and it's polity uttered, "All we can do now is mourn and accept what happened as what fate has brought upon us. He did not die alone. His wife, son and friend were with him.

"The lesson from this is that even though none of us wants to die, we must put the best of us in our relationships with others and contribute our best to our society and nation as these are what people will remember after us.

"I want to urge his colleagues to sustain his

legacies, his philanthropic activities part of which is the Lagos City Marathon which has been expanded beyond the shores of Nigeria as well as the Wigwe University which, I am sure, was for the benefit of Nigerians."

Some of the House members described the late Wigwe as a man who was humble despite his financial strength.

"Though very wealthy, he brought himself to understanding people. He was a friend of this state for many years. He despised domestic violence and spoke against it vehemently," Hon. Desmond Elliot said.

Honourable Adedamola Kasumu Position: Deputy Majority Leader

onourable Adedamola Richard Kasumu, born on 29th March 1983 in London, England, is an indigene of Lagos State. He is a legislator at the existing 10th Legislative Assembly. His journey at the Assembly began in 2015 after claiming a convincing victory at the polls to become a member of the 8th Legislative Assembly as representative of Ikeja Constituecy 02 under the All Progressive Congress, APC, hence, becaming the youngest lawmaker in the Assembly. During this period, Hon. Kasunmu also served as the Chairman, House Committee Youth, Sports and Social Development, among other adhoc services and functions.

His first term spanned through 2015-2019 and therefore got a return certificate having won in the election for a second term in his Constituency. He won the election in March 2019 and was sworn-in as a

member of the 9th Assembly on June 7th 2019, also doubling as the C hairman, House Committee on Lands from November 2019 to May 2023.

The lawmaker contested again for the same seat in the 2023 elections and was re-elected to become part of the 10th Legislative Assembly in a historic third term win on the 18th of March 2023 with a landslide victory, thus, once again making him the first lawmaker to be re-elected for a third term in the history of Ikeja Constituency 2 and later became the Deputy Majority Leader.

Omotoso Advocates Bridging Generational Gap Between Old and Young Politicians

Gbenga Omotoso Frederick Ikyaan, who represented Governor Hyacinth Alia, and the MD/CEO, Tpumpy Estate Development, Mr. Akintayo Adaralegbe.

To Omotoso, there is a need for the youth to become more involved in political parties, parliaments, political appointments, elections, and civic spaces as a matter of right (rather than of benevolence as it is sometimes suggested) and as part of the solution rather than a problem to be resolved by others.

Omotoso's lecture was titled: "Closing The Generational Gap between The Old and Young In Nigerian Politics". He noted that through legislative actions, youth empowerment programmes, and inclusive governance structures, Nigerians will witness a gradual but significant transformation in the country.

He said that as the nation grapples with the dynamics between the old and the young, it becomes imperative for both generations to collaborate and learn from each other's experiences, forging a path



that combines the wisdom of the past with the innovation and energy of the present to tackle the challenges of the future.

His words, "The common cliché that youths are leaders of tomorrow is no longer in tune with present-day reality. The truth is that what becomes of tomorrow is determined by what happens today. So, the more everyone grasps the fact that the youth are actually the leaders of today and not tomorrow, the better for all".

The Commissioner pointed out that with the younger members of Governor Babajide Sanwo-Olu's cabinet in Lagos State, one is bound to reaffirm that the future is now. "Fortunately, they have not disappointed the people as they cover themselves in glory through trail-blazing performances."

The school headmistress represented by Miss Oni glowingly appreciated the council chairman and the KICC for hearken their



The First Language Our Hope -Solomon Atala

lubunmi Atala's idea of personal and national development is predicated on the effective use of mother's tongue as the medium of knowledge dissemination and acquisition.

Ironically Atala is an American trained architect who believes he would have done better if he had learnt architecture in Yoruba instead of English Language

He attended University of Maryland, (UMES) Princess Ann, Maryland in 1975.

He transferred to Howard University, Washington, D.C. in 1976, from where he obtained a Maste's degree in Architecture in 1980.

However, he is an addict believer in the use of indigenous language as the basis on which Nigeria can get out of its steady educational fall and economic debacle.


In his 368-page book, "The First Language Our Hope; Idea Towards A Great Africa", Atala posits that Africa remains generally underdeveloped compared with the rest of the world due to its education which is on the wrong pedestal-- in foreign languages.

"Africa consumes what other nations produce, and it is not ashamed. Africa begs for loans and aids and other help matters in-spite of its own abundant resources," he writes. The book has 22 chapters and details events in politics, religion and economy, comparing Nigeria of the old to the present one and also speaking about the developed economy as a control to the present situation Africa and Nigeria in particular had found itself.

The author is a vast reader as his knowledge of dates of events reflects vividly in his writings, using biblical, traditional and social languages and Yoruba to drive home his points.

"Concerning the construction of the Tower of Babel to reach heaven, my own Bible says: When their language was one, nothing shall be impossible for them. Notwithstanding, their language that got scattered to many languages, "language" remains "language" with its precepts," he writes.

Quoting him, "In 1997, as a student of the Bible, I read within "The Origin and Growth of the English Bible" in the "Addendum" to my Favorite Bible-- Thompson Chain Refence Bible that: the word of Olodumare was locked up in Latin up till 14th century when John Wycliffe saw the rationale, the benefit, in translating the Bible to common English vernacular so that everybody in his country could read and understand deeply the word of God. The Bible was the central text book as of that time. Some of us know the 14th century as the



Other eras that followed Renaissance include: Reformation, Scientific Revolution, the First Industrial Revolution, Agric Revolution, the American and French Revolutions and a General Enlightenment period.

The Second Industrial Revolution (the attainment of Modernity) capped these earlier eras as the Western European countries and America could now produce machines, including automobiles, electricity and steel in place of iron.


Precisely in 1884/ 1885, at the realization of the Second Industrial Revolution, seven European nations sat in Berlin, Germany to impose their languages and cultures on Africa. Their languages have locked up education from majority of our people. That singular act sent Africa back to the Dark Ages

which ended in the 15th century. Educate everybody in Africa in the first languages: That means there will no longer be an illiterate person in Africa. And that will impact governance in the communities positively.

Providence has a role to play in Atala's venture in 2019, when he took his manuscript to the English Language Department, UNILAG for assessment. To assess the manuscript, Dr Ayodeji Adedara was recommended by Prof Hope Eghagha, then Head of English Language Department.

They both concluded that Africa is not modern because the continent has not used its first languages in the education of its people as done by others since renaissance. Other people dropped foreign Latin for their own vernaculars since the 14th century.

He said, "As I continued to research on earlier efforts to validate my advocacy, I read about the experiment that Professor Babs Fafunwadid from 1970 to 1978, with some students in now Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife. His experiment affirmed that students will do better when educated in the mother tongues.



The First Language Our Hope -Solomon Atala



The last two chapters 20 and 21 of the book, "Language and Culture 1 and Language and Culture 2, according to, Tayo Ogunlewe, a Professor of English, Literature in English and Cultural Studies of the Lagos State University, is a timely and seemingly significant contribution towards the debate and advocacy for mother tongue education.

To him Language is one of human kind's greatest achievements and one of the most important resources. It is a subject that is endlessly fascinating in itself. Within the range of human experience, the acquisition of language is one of the most conspicuous sensibilities, uniquely characteristic of the species. An awareness of history, the passage of time and experience, becomes the for the human community the mechanism where we define ourselves, looking to our past for a self authenticating sense of purpose and direction and then, in turn, looking to our future with resolve and determination.

More properly put, it is a call, loud and emphatic for a recognition of, not just the mother tongue but for a reappraisal of the value and the need for better recognition and valuation of indigenous African and valuation of indigenous African knowledge systems. The term indigenous may appear problematic because it appears to collectivize many district populations whose experiences under colonialism have been somewhat different, probably vastly so. Other collective terms akin to or synonymous to it include "Native",


"First people", "Aboriginals and quite a few others. While not denying the very powerful worldviews embedded in such terms, within my own intellectual framework in this review I intend to implicate or privilege the term "Mother Tongue". And "Indigenous".

A book like this is long overdue, it is entitled: The first Language, Our Hope: Ideas towards a Great Africa

It will be most useful for mothertongue or first language activists, indigenous knowledge systems advocates, linguistics scholars, educational policy planners and the general public.

The author is oddly enough an architect rather than (as one would ordinarily presume) a languish, a literary theorist or an educationist or probably a social activist.

The basic or fundamental position and advocacy in this book is that Africa and Africans, the continent and its peoples, must endeavour to return their first languages, native languages and mother tongues to its place of honour in their societies. Indigenous languages should be not only be given pride of place, but elevated to prominence across all levels of our education structure/systems and even governances. What does this mean? It simply means that society, our society should belong to us. Yorubas should be taught in Yoruba. Children in Yorubaland ought to be able to learn arithmetic, physics, chemistry, Shakespeare etc in Yoruba. Ditto for Ibo Children, Ewe children, Ashanti, Zulu, Masai etc in their respective homelands and societies. Despite the imposition of English, French, Portuguese and Arabic by



The book in its 22 chapters gives a sweeping overview of stories, values, practices/struggles, examples and ways of knowing which continue to inform indigenous pedagogies and experiences. The opening, from the prologue to chapter 7 gives the author's perspectives on the Nigerian and American Constitutions, leadership styles in comparison, interrogating the merits and demerits of each approach.

Chapters 8-15 explores societal consciousness, values, faith and liberty using biographical commentaries on notable African patriots like Nelson Mandela, Wole Soyinka, Fela Kuti and Tai Solarin as icons of the struggle to emancipate and decolonize the African consciousness for a repossession of Africa by Africans. Chapters 16 and 17 calls for the political will by African governments and its elites, using the Nigerian context as example, for a return to regionalism as opposed to the present unitary arrangement that blatantly refuses to acknowledge the peculiarities and differences of the various and different ethnolinguistic groups. Personally, I am of the opinion that moving a contraption in which over 400 diverse linguistic ethnicities and

cultures who do not share the same vision and thus cannot have the same mission is an exercise in futility.

A major reason why the country with all its vaunted resources is in a state of stagnation since independence. Productivity and ingenuity are two sides of the same coin. As the old saying avers "Necessity is the mother of invention". For productivity, enthusiasm is key.

Nigeria has been stagnant in very many key areas and talk has been long while action has been short.

Chapters 18-21 examine the roles of education, language and culture in an increasingly competitive world. In the 19th Chapter, the author took time out to note the place of utilization and maximization of resources including business ideas and practices viz a viz the quality of education in any given society. The USA was the preferred example, and finally, the Epilogue where the author's advocacy of the mother tongue or native language is further emphasized in rounding off his philosophical odyssey on the best way by which Africa may achieve greatness and Africans achieve respectability among other achievers on the universal stage.

To further affirm his passion for his agenda of promoting mother tongue education, indigenous knowledge systems and unity, Solomon Atala has gone on to" put his money where his mouth is by translating his effort into Yoruba, his first language, complete with a bibliography and a glossary to probably to satisfy academic nitpicks and establish his scholarship.
