## Prices of Christmas Trees Rise By 300%

corporate and religious organisations have dusted their old Christmas trees for display due to sharp increase in the prices of new ones in the market.

Echonews visited Indoor/Outdoor some places around Lagos and observed that corporate headquarters of some companies and religious bodies brought out their former Christmas trees to decorate their buildings.

Our correspondent also visited Balogun Market, Lagos Island to compare prices and found out that the costs of Christmas trees and other decoration had increased by over 300 per cent in the last one year.

One pc of American outdoor pine pre-lit tree now costs about N900, 000. One pc of Christmas Tree with 400 Tips For Fullness, Artificial Canadian Fir Full Bodied Christmas Tree With Plastics Stand, Scene Decor, Room Decor, Home Decor, Holiday Party Decor, Christmas Decor that sold for about N4000 last year now costs N12,000 now.

Christmas Special 5ft Christmas Tree with Free Multicolour Christmas Lights that was sold for N15, 000 last year now costs N35, 000 now. One pc Lifelike Outdoor Christmas Tree with Red Berries - No Power Needed, Perfect for All determines the

> "None of this is made in Nigeria as you can see and the rise in the prices is due to Naira to Dollar rate, a vendor Mr. Daniel Brown told our correspondent. He stated that it is high time Nigeria begins to produce little things like this otherwise, people will buy it at higher price come next year.

> Brown noted that many brands of the Christmas trees come from China, calling on Nigeria youths to learn from the idea. "I know our youths can do this thing if they can channel their energy towards it," he said.






Two years ago, the agency in collaboration with the Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA), transformed

"We partnered with LAWMA on the initiative to use recyclables that we see on the roads and in our





# The Deputy Governor of Lagos State, Dr. Kadri Obafemi Hamzat, has applauded over 5,000 newly trained Law Enforcement Officers of the State. He reiterated the present administration's commitment to ensuring the safety and security of



governance.
Dr. Hamzat, represented by the Commissioner for Transportation, Mr. Oluwaseun Osiyemi, commended the CEO of LETI, Mrs. Abiola Adeyinka and her team for their pivotal role in advancing the sixth pillar of the T.H.E.M.E.S Plus Agenda, which focuses on security and governance.

The Deputy Governor praised the Institute for its consistent delivery of proactive and essential training programmes aimed at enhancing the professionalism and conduct of law enforcement personnel.

"The continuous development and training programmes conducted by LETI have significantly impacted governance at the grassroots level", Dr. Hamzat stated, noting that "Previous participants have demonstrated exemplary professionalism, earning the trust and respect of residents in their communities. I have no doubt that this new batch of graduates will uphold and exceed these standards."

He highlighted Lagos State's position as the fifth-largest economy in Africa and a leader in public service excellence. He reaffirmed the present a d m i n i s t r a t i o n ' s dedication to staff welfare and capacity building, noting that various opportunities exist for professional development within the Lagos State Public Service.

He urged the graduating officers to apply the skills and techniques acquired during their training to their respective roles, particularly as the State enters the "Ember" months, a period often characterised by heightened security challenges.

Dr. Hamzat further emphasised the importance of public support in achieving security objectives. "Government cannot do it alone. The cooperation and support of the public for our security strategies and initiatives have been encouraging," he said.

They affirmed that the training exercise would further enhance the discharge of their duties as they have been exposed to emotional intelligence, professionalism and the use of force; these, they said, have aided them in carrying out their duties diligently without chaos. ## Lagos, NCDC Collaborate On Environmental Surveillance

he Lagos State Government on T u e s d a y expressed its readiness to support the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control and Prevention (NCDC) on the launch of the Environmental S u r v e i l l a n c e Programme (ESPN) in the State.

The Commissioner for the Environment and Water Resources, Mr. Tokunbo Wahab made this known when delegates from NCDC led by the Consultant on Needs Assessment, Prof Olatunji Kolawole came on a courtesy visit to the Ministry to inform that the State had been selected as a site for the surveillance initiative.

Wahab said the Health and Environment sectors cannot be separated as such the multi-sectoral approach to surveillance is a welcome development. "I am glad we are having this collaboration at this level, interestingly for the THEMES Plus Agenda of this administration, the second leg of that pillar is called Health and Environment; So for those that are knowledgeable, you will all agree that you can never separate the effects of the Environment on the Health Sector", he said. He said the government is willing to collaborate

whenever the cause and effect of the Environment and Health is being discussed, saying if the government fixes the basics in the environmental ecosystem, it will definitely reduce the cost of the challenges that are being experienced in the health sector.

He said the programme aims to establish a robust Environmental Surveillance system across the State with the capacity to detect outbreak-prone pathogens, monitor endemic disease patterns, support clinical surveillance, inform vaccination strategies, and act as

an early warning system for future outbreaks.

He said the Ministry of Environment and Water Resources had in the recent past worked assiduously with the Ministry of Health during the cholera outbreak to proffer a lasting solution, adding that it is whatever the Environment is unable to fix that ultimately becomes a challenge in the health sector.

According to him, "We welcome you to Lagos, as Lagos believes the environment is the father of all; we need to fix whatever we have to fix w ith the collaboration of our Agencies which ranges from LASEPA to

LASWMO as well as LAWMA".


Wahab stressed that since Lagos State has been selected as one of the five Phase II pilot States for this important initiative, the Ministry is ready and willing to collaborate with NCDC to evaluate site requirements and resources critical for establishing effective environmental surveillance operations in the State.

The Consultant on Needs Assessment, Prof. Olatunji Kolawole in his response expressed appreciation to the State for its cooperation, saying it will greatly enhance the s m o o t h implementation of the

ESPN project's objectives in Lagos State.

He added that the assessment consultant and their team will coordinate closely with relevant state officials to conduct these as sessments effectively.

The Governor said the commissioning of the project is another fulfillment of his administration's commitment to fostering sustainable development through the continuous provision of efficient infrastructure, as well as a testament to the enduring partnership between government and the good people of Lagos State.

The project commissioned by Governor Sanwo-Olu comprises a bridge and a network of four roads with a total length of 1.8 kilometres, including a 250-meter-long deck on a pile with a nine-meter-wide semi-rigid pavement finish.

The infrastructure is

further enhanced by the installation of solarpowered streetlights. It provides safe and accessible motorable routes for the Igando-Ayobo community and surrounding settlements. Speaking during the commissioning ceremony attended by the Deputy Governor, Dr. Obafemi Hamzat; Senator representing Lagos West, Senator Oluranti Adebule; members of the State Executive Council and the Lagos State House of Assembly; traditional, religious and political

leaders, among others, Governor Sanwo-Olu expressed confidence that the delivery of the projects will further enhance economic achievements in the Alimosho area of the State.

The Governor said the critical infrastructure



project delivered on schedule, reflected his administration's dedication to improving the lives of Lagosians through purposeful governance.

He said, "This achievement underscores our administration's resolve to back our words with action. For the good people of Alimosho, this is not just a road and bridge; it is a reaffirmation of our commitment to building infrastructure that serves both immediate needs and long-term growth.



convicted to a fine of #500,000 or a term of six months custodial sentence while subsequent offenders get a fine up to #750,000 and a longer

"The Human Organ Harvesting and Tissue Transplant Law regulates organ donation and bans illegal harvesting and sales. Violation risks up to

#10,000,000 in fines or 10 years imprisonment. Victim Assistance and Witness Protection Law provides support and safety for crime victims and witnesses through relocation. legal aid and counselling", he stated.

Commissioner said the Lagos State Fire and Rescue Service Law improves fire services and enforces safety measures while failure to comply attracts a fine of up to #5,000,000 or two years imprisonment

He also submitted that the Lagos State **Enforcement Training** Institute Law seeks to enhance training for law enforcement officers to improve professionalism and public safety.

The Attorney-General

stressed that the new laws ensure businesses are accountable, citizens' rights are protected, and medical institutions uphold their ethics while safeguarding individuals from exploitation.

"Also by supporting victims' witnesses, the laws promote cooperation within the Speaking further, the justice system. Additionally, they strengthen emergency response services and reflect the government's dedication to building a safer, healthier and great Lagos for everyone", Pedro said.

# Lawyer On Trial Over Alleged Forgery, Theft

he Magistrates' Court in Yaba, Lagos prosecuting a lawyer, Chinwuba Ekene, over allegations of forging a court order.

During his arraignment at the courtz, 39-yearold. Ekene, was remanded in prison custody after he was also alleged to have commited theft of N49,592,000.

Police Prosecutor, Supol Idowu Osungbure, stated that the accused is facing three count charge bordering on conspiracy, forgery, breaking and entering and stealing.

Osungbure told the court that the defendant conspired with others who are now at large sometime in June 2024, at House 6, G Close, 322 Road, FESTAC Town, Lagos.

According to the prosecutor, Ekene broke

into the apartment of one Helen Ekwem the complainant, through the forged court order and carted away properties in the name of carrying out lawful execution of a judgment of the court, a representation he knew to be false. illegal and unlawful.

Furthermore, Osungbure mentioned that the defendant stole a Toyota Land Cruiser Prado Jeep 2020 model with number plate, NNE 749 FC, a MacBook pro Laptop valued at N2.3m, seven pairs of original suits valued at N560,000, and 15 industrial fans valued at N1,830,000.

Other items stolen items include a stud earrings valued at N360,000, Hublot wristwatches valued at N700000, a Jacobs



& co perfume, Snaty, chairs valued at valued at N62,000, 25 N750,000. pairs of shoes valued at The Prosecutor also N1m, untouched accused the perfumes valued defendant of stealing N124,000, Evoke the original car perfume valued documents also N47,000, 2000 piece of belonging to the savings box valued at complainant. "He {the suspect} forged documents of the CBBC Career College, Canada, to obtain money from the complainant, Michael. By doing this, he contravened Sections, 411, 314 (1) (a), and 365 (2) (b), of the Criminal Laws of Lagos State 2015."

The defendant pleaded not guilty.

The court granted him bail, in the sum of N4m, with two sureties each in like sum. The sureties were ordered to provide evidence of tax payment to the Lagos State Government and their addresses be verified.

Next arraignment of the suspect is on January 17, 2025.

## 2025 Budget: Agege LG Presents N14.2bn

he Agege Local Government Area of Lagos State has presented N14.2 billion 2025 budget to its legislative arm.

The chairman said the key highlights of the budget include sustaining infrastructure growth by completing ongoing projects and initiating new ones to further engender development in the
