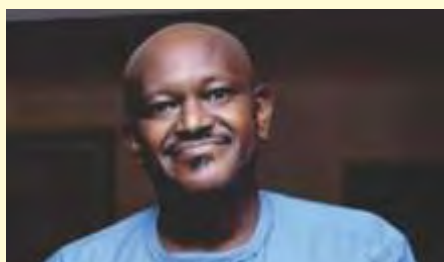

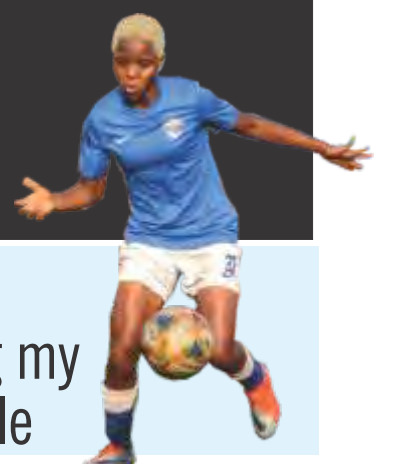

Lagos 2023: Accord guber candidate, Dickson to dump party for APC

Barely 47 days to the governorship election, there are indications that the governorship candidate of Accord Party (AP), Hakeem Olaogun-Dickson may terminate his ambition, dump his party and pitch tent with the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC). Reliable sources closed to the candidate and APC in Lagos told ECHONEWS that Dickson may soon declare intention to join APC after negotiation with the ruling party.

ECHONEWS gathered that a meeting has been scheduled for this week between Dickson and some chieftains in the ruling APC, including the Chief of Staff to the Lagos State Governor, Mr. Tayo Ayinde with the input of the Speaker of the Federal House of Representatives, Rt. Hon. Femi Gbajabiamila.

After the purported meeting this week, it is expected that Dickson will formally announce his defection from Accord Party to APC.

As earlier reported by ECHONEWS, Lagos political observers had envisaged the defection of Dickson to APC, saying it would be added advantage for the ruling party.

Dickson is a former chairman of Surulere Local Government. He was appointed in 2017 by Governor Akinwunmi Ambode as the Director General of the Lagos State Safety Commission.

In May, 2022, Accord Party (AP) unanimously unveiled him as its governorship candidate for Lagos State for the 2023 gubernatorial election. He had earlier been nominated at the party's primaries which was held at the Airport Hotel, Ikeja.

While declaring him as the governorship candidate, the chairman of the Electoral Committee of the party, Comrade Lanre Ogundare, said: "By the power vested in me, I, hereby, declare Hon.

Hakeem Olaogun Onikoyi Dickson as the governorship candidate of Accord Party for the 2023 General Elections."

Reacting to the nomination, Dickson tendered his acceptance speech. "With a grateful heart and the sole obligation to devote every effort of my body, mind and spirit to lead our party to victory in 2023 and our State back to greatness, I humbly accept the nomination."

According to the candidate, with this kind of a unity among members of Accord, "We are ready and eager to take on the APC, PDP and other 15 political parties next year 2023."

He added that it would be a year of concern, quiet and sober reassessment of "Our State's" character and purpose.

"It has already been a year when voters have confounded the experts. And I guarantee you that it will be the year when we give the government of this State back to the people of this State," Dickson said.

In the build up to the 2023 general elections, the Lagos State chapter of Labour Party (LP) has revealed plan to roll out its campaign this week.

Since the political activities started across the State with other parties such as the All Progressives Congress (APC) and its strong rival, the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) flying their campaigns through various media, the Labour Party has not been seen with any firm of campaign. However, in a chat last week, the governorship flag bearer of the party in

Lagos State, rGbadebo Rhodes-Vivour good ECHONEWS that his party would commence rolling out of its campaign this week with jingles to be played on radios and televisions.

"We shall roll out our jingles next week. Unlike other parties, we don't have the government's money, we don't take money from the government to do campaign. We do not have the money to be given out to the electorate to buy them to vote for us," he said.

Reaction to a rumour that his party is planning on strategies to rig the election in Lagos State,



Rhodes-Vivour said it was a political gimmick by the opposition parties to divert the attention of the electorate to them and sympathize with them.

"Rig election? Who is rigging the election, the INEC or who? We don't have the money to bribe, those who have taken the

government money are behind it.

"It is a propaganda by the opposition party and we cannot fall for that."

The LP flag bearer expressed confidence that his party will win the election in Lagos State, saying "We are sure of our victory in Lagos State."

Rhodes-Vivour started his political career in 2007 when he contested for the Ikeja Local Government Chairmanship position under the umbrella of the KOWA party.

In 2019, he came out to contest for the Lagos West Senatorial seat under the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) but lost to Senator Adeola Olalekan (Yayi), an All Progressives Congress (APC) candidate.

He headed to the tribunal to challenge the result. Citing incidents of widespread violence and discrepancies in the result, he requested a rerun, which was not granted.

He later sought PDP ticket to contest for the Lagos State governorship seat in 2023 but again, could not secure the ticket due to the internal politics which played out to produce Olajide Adediran, popularly known as Jandor as the party's candidate.

Apart from Rhodes-Vivour, Ade Dosumu, David Kolawole, Olanrewaju Jim-Kamal, and Adedeji Doherty were other aggrieved aspirants under the PDP.

Following the emergence of Adeniran, some other aspirants felt cheated and showed their grievances.

Adediran, a former member of APC, joined the PDP in January, 2022 and declared his intention to run for governor on the PDP platform two months later.

Rhodes-Vivour, thereafter, pitched his tent with Labour Party where he was given the ticket to run for the governorship position in Lagos State.

He emerged the Labour Party's candidate for the Lagos State governorship election after decamping from the PDP.

Following his emergence as the party's candidate, had boasted of victory in the coming governorship race in the state.

Speaking, Rhodes-Vivour expressed his determination to

become the next governor of Lagos State with assurance of winning the election in March, 2023.

He said despite all the propaganda by the opposition parties, his Labour Party will still coast home victory, having the strategy to canvass for people's support.

According to him, it is time for the youth to take over the government to put things in good order.

He appealed to the teeming youths for their collective support to the party to ensure total victory in the general elections.

He said: "We need the youths to take over governance and we shall get it done."

He had boasted to be the beat candidate to become the next governor due he knows how best to restructure the state.

According to him, apart from running under the Labour Party platform, the Lagos residents need a new person like him and that because he is an architect and knows how to design Lagos that will be okay for every resident but not for only the wealthy.

He noted that after lawyer and accountant have ruled, the next is to try an architect.

He said he had gone round the ten local governments under

the Lagos West Senatorial Constituency while he was contesting for the senate under PDP, saying he had got first hand knowledge of what the Lagosians want.

"I know what the people need. I know the place where they never had electricity since 20 years ago. I know where they don't have primary health care center, I know where they don't get school. I know where the government has abandoned them and feel as if they are not part of Lagos State. When become governor, I will serve the people, not my pocket or my family but the people living in Lagos.

"I'm an indigene of Lagos. I will be a leader that everybody can relate with. And again, it is time for the youths, it is the time for power to shift to the youths who form the larger percentage of the population.

"And also, I'm highly intelligent. I graduated from the beat university in the world. I graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology and I have worked with American and Chinese government on urban planning so, I have the experience to work Lagos out."

On infrastructure, the LP flag bearer said he would construct 100km of rail within four years, embark on road

network in the inner communities, making sure the local governments work by making them independent, adding that he will make he would make sure potential governors are made local government chairmen, who can deliver. He said he will also invest in quality education and make the health care facilities work well.

An activist, who turned politician, Rhodes-Vivour was the convener of Nigerians Against GMOs (NAG), an organisation that advocated against the authorisation or introduction of Genetically Modified Foods (GMOs) into Nigeria.

He has also been a frontrunner in advocating for the restoration of history in the school curriculum.

On March 11, 2023, Rhodes-Vivour will compete for the Lagos State governor with Babajide Sanwo-Olu of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Olajide Adediran of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), and Hakeem Olaogun-Dickson of Accord Party (AP).

As earlier reported by ECHONEWS, political analysts in Lagos politics had observed that the election would be between APC and PDP.

However, they believed that it would be difficult for Adediran to break the stronghold of APC backed by the party's

presidential candidate, Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu.

Kehinde Samuel said: "The contest is between Jandor of PDP and the incumbent governor from the ruling party, Mr. Babajide Olusola Sanwo-Olu. Other contestants will barely get sizeable votes and Jandor will only try. Sanwo-Olu will win for the second time because the calculations are in his favour.

"He is the incumbent and his party leadership is strongly with him. In governance, Sanwo-Olu has been at his best and he will hope to consolidate his achievements when he gets reelected. Jandor might come near but Sanwo-Olu will win.

"Labour Party cannot move in Lagos, they are very minority. The guy will only have to make the list."

Another political watcher, Saheed Akintunde said: "PDP seems to be a stronger force now and I have this belief that they will give APC a run for their money this time around. It won't be business as usual come 2023.

"Jide Adeniran is contesting to win, unlike the party's last gubernatorial candidate who was just contesting to make money through negotiation. It will be a serious contest between APC, PDP and let's say Accord party too because they are there to spoil the vote. The LP is not known in Lagos, nobody hears of them."

2023 Appropriation Bill: Council prioritises infrastructure, to gulp N650m

A total of N650 million has been earmarked for the execution of capital projects by the Lagos Island East LCDA in its 2023 appropriation bill with priority on development of infrastructure.

While presenting the proposed budget to the

legislative arm of the council recently, the council chairman, Hon. Dr. Muibi Folawiyo, said more infrastructure projects would be executed in 2023 if the budget is passed by the legislators.

While analysing the provision of the budget, Folawiyo explained that the total size of the budget was N3.6 billion (N3,579,097,779.00)

. According to him, N51,600,000 is budgeted for Social services and Recurrent, while training of staff and welfare will gulp N28,000,000.

"There is always need to train and retrain a staff no matter how efficient he or she is in the discharge of duties. For the efficient running of the Department," he said.

Women Affairs and Poverty Alleviation Department is given N34,000,000 for social service expenditure and recurrent.

For environmental & waste management services, the council will spend N106 million; N132 million is for Agriculture and Social Development; while Primary Health Care Department is to spend N261.3 million in the 1013 fiscal year.

"We intend to improve on the health care delivery of the good people of Lagos Island East. The Construction, rehabilitations and purchase of drugs for

the health centre," the council boss said.

N109.5 million is budgeted for education sector to cater for the construction of schools within the local council, provision of Library equipment and purchase of chairs and tables for schools as well as purchase of JAMB and GCE forms for indigent students.

Political office holders allowance is projected to be N80,000,000.

Speaking, Folawiyo said: "It is my pleasure to welcome you to the presentation of year 2023 budget for Lagos Island East Local Council Development Area tagged Budget of advancement. I want to assure the Legislative Arm that this budget is for the betterment of our community all the projections and estimates were from the outcome of the stakeholders forum.

"We have taken an in-depth study of the needs of our people and we are assuring the good people of Lagos Island East that all their needs

will be met.

"We will provide basic amenities and infrastructure to alleviate the sufferings of our people.

"We are aimed at transforming Lagos Island East into a modest Council in our Megacity. We hope to achieve spectacular transformation with the proposed plan if given the needed support for implementation. It is anticipated that year

Alaba traders fight to regain market in court

Kosofe Local Government Area (LGA), Ikosi-Isheri Local Council Development Area (LCDA), CEO of Total Value Integrated Services Limited, Dr. Chris Onyekachi, Attorney General and Commissioner for Justice, Lagos State; and Ministry of Physical Planning and Urban Development have been given interim injunction by the High Court of Lagos State, Ikeja, restraining them from entering or forcefully taking over the land known as Alaba Section of Mile 12 Market, Kosofe Lagos, pending the determination of a Motion on Notice before it. The Motion on Notice was initiated by the claimants/applicants namely; Incorporated Trustees of Olorere Community Leaders and Traders Association, Yeye Precious Modupe Ojo, Alhaji Akinwale Jimoh, and Babatunde Adetula suing for themselves and on behalf of the traders from the Alaba Section of Mile 12 market.

The Court presided over by Justice (Mrs.) L.A.F Oluayemi also gave an order of interim injunction restraining the defendants/respondents by themselves, their agents, servants, privies, and/or any other person howsoever described from demolishing or forcefully taking over the land known as Alaba Section of Mile 12 Market, Kosofe, Lagos, pending the determination of the Motion on Notice.

Also given by the judge in the suit designated ID/6464GCMW/2022, and brought under Order 42 Rules 1 and 4 and Order 43 of the High Court of Lagos State (Civil Procedure) Rules, 2019, Section 1 of the Preemptive Remedies Section of the Practice

Direction, No 2 of 2019. And under Section 34, Section 36 and Section 43 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, is an order of interim injunction restraining the defendants/respondents by themselves, their agents, servants, privies, and/or any other person howsoever described from building on the land known as Alaba Section of Mile 12 Market, Kosofe Lagos, pending the determination of the

Motion on Notice. Justice Oluayemi on January 11, 2023, further made an order of interim injunction restraining the defendants/respondents by themselves, their agents, servants, privies, and/or any other person howsoever described from letting out the land known as Alaba Section of Mile 12 Market, Kosofe Lagos, pending the determination of the Motion on Notice. Before the injunction order, It was learned that on the 18th of December

2022, the respondents continued with the demolition of the said Market, despite service of court processes and prior agreement by all parties in the office of the Commissioner of Police, Lagos State, held on 17th December 2022 to stay active till the Meeting fixed for the 19th December 2022.

On the 19th day of December, the second meeting was held. All parties who attended the previous meeting also

attended the second one. However, In the meeting, counsel to the applicant, M.G. QUADRI Esq of G.kolawole Quadri & Co was refused entry and chased out by Princess Samiat Abolanle Bada, The Chairman of the Ikosi-Isheri Local Council Development Area.

The respondents orally promised the applicants to begin some sort of resolution process and to stop the further destruction of the Market. Despite the promises

given, the destruction of properties and assault on helpless traders by heavily armed thugs has not stopped, it has only increased exponentially.

From the time the motion on Notice was filed up until now, more parts of the Alaba Section of the Mile 12 Market have been destroyed and demolished.

Traders have been forced away from their shops and thugs have been patrolling the area, assaulting anyone that came closer.

She explained that the style comes in a short or medium length size and the hair is typically cut straight around the head at approximately jaw level,

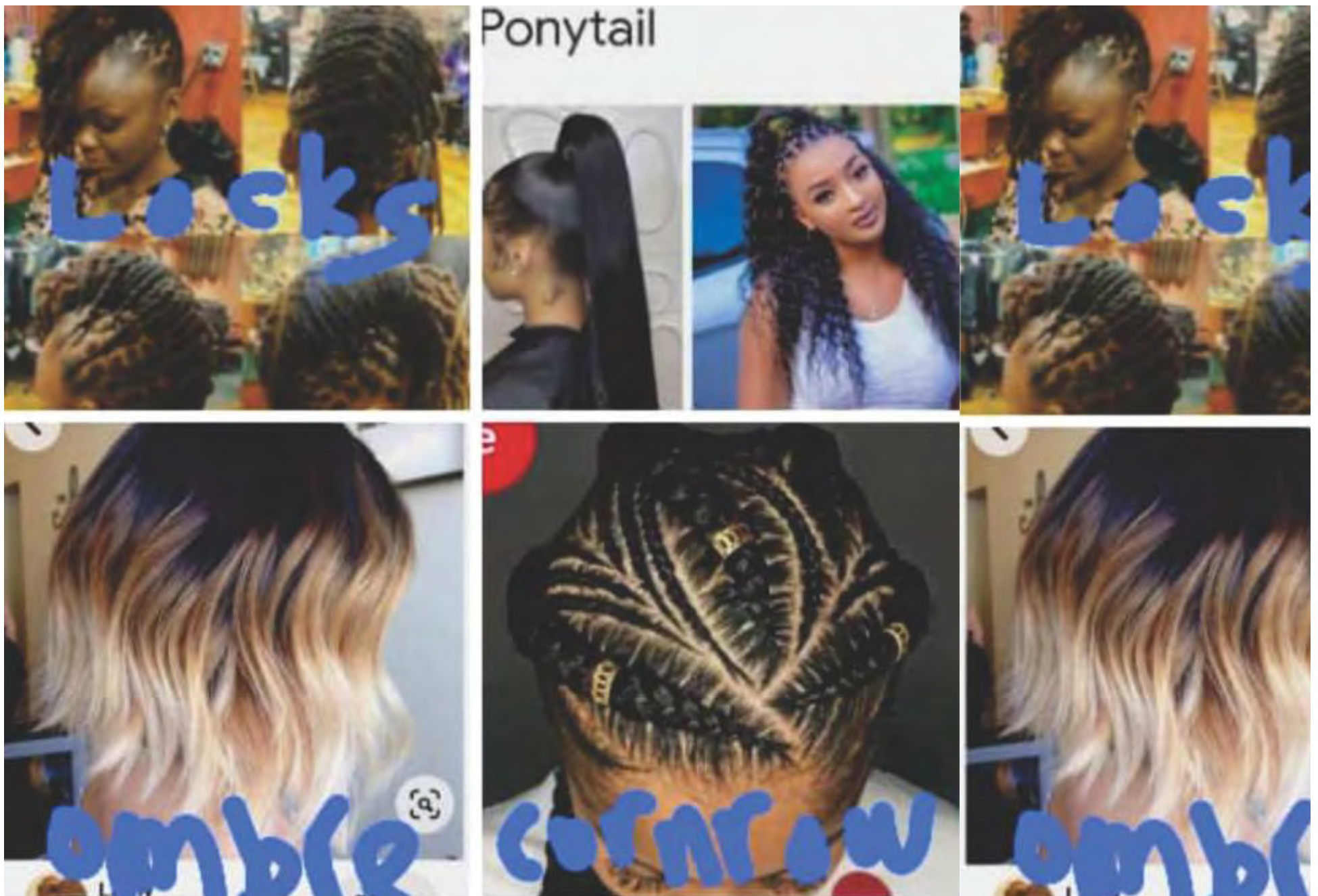
but not longer than the shoulder length and it often comes with fringe or bangs at the front.

Segun Ayobolu: Grit, Quality And Versatility On Diamond Eve

For all his staggering attributes as a very formidable scholar, a distinctly rigorous inquisitor, a sound and profound political scientist, an inimitable reporter, an engaging writer, a perspicacious editor, he savours his reticence and unobtrusive carriage. In a world where dunderheads, impostors and wannabes hug the klieg lights, posturing as modern day standard-bearers, stars and men of letters, coveting conferments and adulation, he cherishes his quiet. He prefers to immerse himself in his study, lapping up multidisciplinary

knowledge, further enriching his subsisting, even overflowing intellectual capital. His elected choices to remain "backstage" in a manner of speaking, receives authentication from his minimal photographic prominence, even on the internet. And we are talking about a colossus in his own right. Reporting for work on my first day at the good old Daily Times of Nigeria Plc in August 1990, the singular acquaintance I had was Gbenga Ayeni. Ayeni, now a professor of mass communications at the East Connecticut State University, (ECSU) in the United States, and I were classmates, brothers and best of friends at the University of Ilorin. He was already on the staff of the Daily Times about two years before me and was excited I was joining him at what then was Nigeria's

largest media organisation. While I was going to serve in *Sunday Times* in the Agidingbi, Ikeja address of the establishment, Ayeni operated from the Kakawa, Lagos Island headquarters of the organisation.

He had been redeployed to the Lagos desk of the London-based *West Africa* magazine, which was owned by the Daily Times conglomerate. Paxton Olu-Idowu was bureau chief of the Nigerian office of the publication and Ayeni worked with him. While I would yet link up with him, I was a momentary loner in Agidingbi. I would subsequently meet the likes of Maurice Ogar, Wole Olatimehin, (now a clergyman) and Edwin Baiye, (now in the US), who were all schoolmates at Unilorin. Tunde Rahman, and Hakeem Bello, media advisers to Bola Tinubu and Babatunde

Fashola, respectively, joined us later. This, however, could not substitute for reunion with Ayeni who was both my course mate and roommate in school, and with whom I played quite some school pranks for years together.

My initial loneliness was not going to persist for long, however. I'm told I'm an extrovert, that I make friends and integrate myself into newfound spaces seamlessly. I didn't need a chaperon as I walked that long *TPD* corridor, flanked on both sides by a million doors, all leading

to the offices and desks of different departments. I spontaneously met new colleagues and began my acclimatisation. There were iconic names one had encountered as an avid reader of Daily Times publications,

which numbered over a dozen at some point. And here I was, meeting them live and direct, in flesh and blood! Segun Ayobolu's was one of those salient, select bylines which had become recurring fixtures, engraved on the minds eye for his very insightful political analyses and resourceful intellectual investments in Daily Times publications.

Ayobolu's desk was on the immediate left once you opened the door of the voluptuous hall called the newsroom. Writers and reporters were scribbling, typists were busy on their *Olympia* typewriters. The audio of television sets could be heard in the background. The slight creak from the hinges of the door I opened, stirred Ayobolu and he looked in my direction. He nodded approvingly and I returned the gesture. I let go of the swing

door and walked up to him. I introduced myself as the newest *Johnny Just Come,* (JJC), as we shook hands and introduced ourselves. "You worked with "The Guardian," I believe," he asked me. "I've read you on the arts and literature review pages."

I smiled and told him I was but a contributor who desired to be heard in the assembly of A-list professionals. While teaching in a rural secondary school in the erstwhile *Oyi* local government area of the pre-August 1991 Kwara State and working on my masters in English, I told Ayobolu, I had unfettered access to some of Nigeria's unsung literary figures who could stand neck-to-neck with their colleagues elsewhere. They didn't receive the breadth and constancy of attention which scholars in the Lagos-Ibadan-lfe

tripod of institutions, enjoyed. David Cook, (British); Zulu Sofola; Olu Obafemi; Oludare Olajubu; Akanji Nasiru, were some of those eggheads. While doing my masters work, I interviewed them and sent the manuscripts to *The Guardian,* I said to Ayobolu.

We hit it as colleagues and friends from that moment. I would subsequently make more acquaintances thereafter. One could see Ayobolu's most dutiful application to his work, his untiring commitment, the enviable fervour he deployed. Information technology was not as advanced as we have today, so the entire newspaper production system was almost totally manual. Political activities were gaining pseudo-traction under the administration of former President Ibrahim Babangida, and the newspaper sustained a daily

section in the tabloid, and the political desk trusted to generate

front-page or backpage reports.

Ayobolu attended the daily "editorial meeting" chaired by the superintending editor who included Onyema Ugochukwu, Femi Sonaike, Dapo Aderinola at various times, in our generation. He then rallied his team including Emeka Nwosu, Basil Obi, Tunde Rahman among others, to generate content for the political pages. He routinely functioned as sub-editor, wielding that famous metal ruler to allocate space to various essays, reports and photographs. The library was adjacent the newsroom where relevant photographs and illustrations. Ayobolu slept in the office on a number of occasions, trying to get the job done. We were basically quasi-

bachelors and could take some risks. But such was Ayobolu's immersion in his vocation.

Ayobolu's intellectual versatility, his voracious appetite for knowledge, his scholastic expansiveness, his free-range mind of the prototype academic, find expression in his journalistic oeuvre. He gobbles poetry, works of prose, literary criticism, biographies, speeches, with the appetite of one facing an examination everyday. His insights into wisdom's broad-spectrum, ooze from his journalistic output. To make assurance doubly sure, Ayobolu has reviewed four of my published books and written the *Foreword* to my upcoming aggregation of essays and articles. As in other instances, Ayobolu leaves you in no doubt about his depth,

infinite vistas and abundance of capacity. Very few, ranking professors anywhere in the world, will do a better job of the laurel-deserving dilation of my works, than Ayobolu has done in all instances.

Joe Ibekwe one of our colleagues at the *Times* who now wields a doctorate, it was who reminded us on the *Daily Times Alumni Platform,* yesterday, that the date, Tuesday January 17, 2023 was the

birthday of this beloved brother, exemplary colleague and inimitable professional, Segun Ayobolu. Across the road in our good old Agidingbi *Daily Times* office was *White House,* a restaurant and bar so christendom by we the regulars, after the colour of the building. Typically, whenever our "travel claims," "continues honorarium" or "out-of-state" travel allowances were paid, or whenever some

generous emolument was extended to us for genuine professional help, *White House* was the instantaneous converge. As desks in the newsroom emptied to an unspoken signal for assembly one of those days, Femi Ajayi, who was the science editor, remarked cheekily to the hearing of some of us: "Those guys have made a kill. They are going to their rendezvous!"

Milestones such as Ayobolu's yesterday, would have engendered spontaneous congregation at *White House,* our famous watering hole. Gboyega Okegbenro, Emeka Nwosu, Lawal Ogienagbon, Musa Ebomhiana, Adamson Momoh, Bayo Oladipo, Yemisi Fadairo, (Basil Obi, Femi Olatunde, Imokhuede Ogunleye, Edna Aguocha, the last four sadly no longer with us). We were quite a

bunch. Friends from elsewhere joined us on a day yesterday, including Ohi Alegbe, Reuben Abati, Gabriel Omohinmi, (Ademola Babajide, Eddie Ayo-Ojo, also gone to be with the Lord). The waiter at *White House* would be deployed in an endless relay, serving an assortment of drinks, going and coming, coming and going, regularly quizzed about the tepid temperature of lagers and similar liquids. The kitchen, would eternally simmer with the aroma of pepper soup, peppered meat and allied delicacies. The chant of *O yes ooooo* will seize the space. Title editors will be glad we all had turned in our copies before plunging into such revelry, which could well spillover to *point and kill* joints in Ogba, Alausa and similar places!

Segun Ayobolu was born January 17, 1964. His father, Elder Bamidele Samuel Ayobolu was one

of the earliest sets of graduates from the Ahmadu Bello University, (ABU), Zaria, in the 1950s. Baba also obtained a diploma in administration at the London School of Economics, (LSE). The very bright and brilliant Segun Ayobolu therefore got off to a pacy educational start, obtaining his bachelors' and masters' degrees in political science at the University of Ibadan in quick succession, between the ages of 21 and 24. His lecturers conceived of retaining him for his doctorate, so he could pursue a career in the academia. The young and restless Ayobolu, however, voted for the media as a career which could find fulfilment even as a budding scholar. The mammoth "invasion" of newsrooms by academics and technocrats heightened by the

inauguration of *The Guardian* in 1983, was a compelling inspiration for many of us.

Ayobolu was at various times: reporter, features writer, political editor and Editorial Board Chairman in *Daily Times.* He edited the *Sunday Times,* sister publication of the *Daily Times,* and has functioned as publicist in different departments of the nation's governance structure. He served as Chief Press Secretary to several public office holders, notably: the Senate President in the defunct Third Republic, (1992 to 1993); Federal Minister of Education, (1993 to 1995), and the Governor of Lagos State, between 1999 and 2007, at the outset of the subsisting Fourth Republic. He was also Special Adviser on Information and Strategy to the Lagos State Governor,

between 2007 and 2009. A columnist and Senior Member of the Editorial Board of *The Nation* newspaper, he is also an "Editor-at-large" of the newspaper. Ayobolu has in his pouch, enormous perspectives about different strands of our sociopolitics which he must avail Nigerians.

Ayobolu has been published in several journals and books, and has presented papers at several conferences and programmes. He has been involved with publications like: *Tinubu: In The Mirror Of The Press: What the Papers Say: A Collection Of Press Reports On Senator Ahmed Tinubu's Activities As Executive Governor Of Lagos State.* He has also produced *Biographical Sketches Of Members Of Tinubu's Millennium Cabinet: May 1999 to May 2003* and *Dele Alake: The Writer As Strategist.* He co-edited the

book: *Asiwaju: Leadership In Troubled Times,* (published in 2012), with Tunji Bello and Sam Omatseye. He is married to Justice (Mrs) Ayo Ayobolu, and blessed with children and grandchildren.

People with Blood Group O and Blood Group B, continuous consumption of cashew nuts and groundnuts is not ok for you. People with Blood Group B, apart from Cashew nuts and groundnuts, they are ok. But People with Blood Group O should avoid all nuts generally or have a minimal intake of nuts because nuts contain aflotoxins which the body of a person with Blood Group O cannot digest. Nuts are generally ok for people with Blood Group A. One man's food is another man's poison. People with Blood Group O, avoid yoghurt or reduce your intake of yoghurt. People with Blood Group A and Blood Group B, free yoghurt for you. Milk is very good and contains calcium but it is not a good source of Calcium for someone with Blood Group O. University of Peace, APCA on study trip to Morocco

Who is in control of Western Sahara between the Kingdom of Morocco and the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic, SADR? Between January 4 and 13th this year, the students of the University of Peace, a United Nations institution established through the General Assembly resolution 35/55 of December 5, 1980, embarked on a study trip to Morocco to see for themselves.

The students formed the top brass of security and diplomatic circles in Senegal, Gabon, Cameroon, and Benin. The Association of Political Consultants-Africa with three nominees from Nigeria and one from Ethiopia, was invited to join the study trip. The APCA team comprised this writer, Tope Ajayi, Paul Fregene and Endalkachew Abera. The trip, put together by Dr. Abdoulatif Aidara, who co-ordinates CISPAIX's activities in Senegal, involved key functionaries of the university such as the director of programmes Professor Samuel Ewusi, the secretary, Professor Esther Ndutu, top police officers from Senegal and Gabon and academics from Senegal and Benin. The officers are doctoral students of the university.

On January 8, the delegation met officials of the Moroccan government in Rabat. These officials made

presentations on the history of Western Sahara in pre-colonial times when the Kingdom of Morocco controlled the Western Sahara and shared boundaries with other nations at the River Senegal.

According to them, the question of what should happen to the Western Sahara became an issue following the end of Spanish colonial rule in 1975 and the need for governance over the territory from which Spain withdrew. The Moroccan government re-established its control over the area but this became a subject of conflict with a group known as the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic that till today contests Morocco's claim.

The Moroccan kingdom believes the SADR has the voice of Jacob but the hand of Esau arguing that without the active financial and diplomatic support of the Republic of Algeria, the SADR would not exist. Indeed, it insists that the only government that serve the people of the Western Sahara is the kingdom of Morocco which has put in place an administration at Dikhla headed by the governor and observed by over 17 governments represented by their consular officials.

The visit to Dakhla which was meant to demonstrate and convince the delegation that Morocco is both in power and in control of the territory took place on January 11, 2023. There was,

indeed, a peaceful environment in the city as residents freely pursued their businesses. Women and children mingled freely in the parks while the markets bristled with buying and selling.

The delegates visited the Dakhla Regional Investment Centre and were briefed on ongoing efforts to promote investment, provide access to funds and provide business intelligence. To provide appropriate skills for industries, the agency said it has set up schools for commerce, tourism, technology, and agriculture. It also visited the Dakhla Fisheries firm and learned how the company exports fish to the international market.

Both events reinforced the position of the government that it is on the ground and that the international community should put pressure on the SADR and the Algerian government which provides it a place to operate to dialogue to resolve the

impasse.

As Najlac Benbarek, the director of Diplomacy said, the issue of the Western Saharaz is no longer

about selling a particular view to the world, it is about how the conscious effort of the government to develop the people

can convince the world of the commitment of Morocco to the progress of the people of Western Sahara.
