## Stealing Dominates Criminal Cases In Lagos

he Lagos State Criminal Information System (LCIS) has revealed that stealing dominated criminal cases in the state, with 21,084 cases representing 44 percent.

This was followed by breaches of peace with 7,044 cases (15 percent), armed robbery at 10 percent (4,518 cases), and sexual crimes being the least at five percent with 2,231 cases.

These statistics were confirmed by our correspondent who has been monitoring proceedings at the various courts.

Our correspondent gathered that no fewer than 20 theft-related offences are heard in courts monthly.

Between August 15 and September 15 that our correspondent monitored court proceedings in some parts of Lagos, it was observed that at least one case of domestic theft is heard in the court.

First was a 33-year-old driver, Oluwatosin Eko, who allegedly stole his employer's N22,280,000.

He was arraigned before the Igbosere Magistrate Court, Ebute-Meta on two counts bordering on conspiracy, and stealing.

Eko also stole two sets of gold jewelry valued at N16,000,000 all amounting to N22,280,000, all belonging to his employer, one Aderonke Sodeke.

On July 1, Security personnel arraigned before the Ogudu Magistrates' Court, Lagos, for stealing N250,000 and 50 litres of diesel valued at N50,000 from St Agnes Catholic Church, Maryland, Ikeja, Lagos.

The defendants, Victor Odeh, 22; Jeremiah Negedu 32; Ubi Mbeh, 40; and Idris Olatunji, 44 were standing trial on a three-count charge of conspiracy, stealing and burglary preferred against them by the police.

The prosecutor, Insp Sunday Bassey, told the court that the defendants committed the offences on July 1, at about 1:00 a.m., at St Agnes Catholic Church, Maryland, Ikeja, Lagos

A 33-year-old cleaner, Charles

Sunday, who was arraigned before the Ebute-Metta Magistrate Court in Lagos for allegedly stealing a gold chain and other items valued at N3.250,000 from his employer. Sunday, who resides at No. 15, Orchid Road, Eleganza, Lekki, is facing a charge of stealing.

The Police Prosecutor, Inspector Cyriacus Osuji, told the court that the defendant committed the alleged crime while employed as a cleaner for the complainant, Mr Temitope Aremu.

He said the incident took place between July and August 2024 at the Horizon Court Estate, Ikate, Lekki.In another case of theft, one Semeko Atewon, allegedly stole an Infinity Smart 8 phone valued at N150,000.

Another suspect identified as Jimoh Samod is on trial for allegedly stealing slippers worth N3,045,000 in Badagry, Lagos.

27-year-old Samod was arraigned at the Magistrates' Court in Badagry on accusations of stealing 203 packs of slippers.

Inspector Edet Ekpo, standing as Prosecutor, said that the defendant, put on one count charge of stealing, committed the offence between July 5 and

July 6 at Jegba, Marina area of Badagry.

At the Magistrates' Court in Ikorodu the trio of Azeez Sadiq, 35, Taiwo Olayinka, 30 and Monsurudeen Saheed, 21, were accused of dragging their

victims to a secluded area and forcefully collected sum N13,000 from them.

Even though the gang pleaded not guilty, the Prosecutor still maintained that they committed the offences on August 20, at about 12 p.m. at Mobile petrol station, behind F One Bar, Ikorodu, Lagos, thus, contravening Sections 411, 172 and 287 of the Criminal Law of Lagos State, 2015.

Cases of persons stealing at their workplace were also held in courts and no fewer than five suspects were arraigned for stealing from their employers.

Three security guards, Bullum Agim, 38, Gabriel Edet, 31 and Samuel Nkana, 33, were remanded for allegedly stealing Aluminum Materials worth N61,000,000.

The police operatives at Maroko Division, where the matter was reported by the employer, accused the employees of stealing the items at No 6, Olunda Ogungbe street, Lekki, where they were initially employed to guard the stolen items.

At the Ebute-Meta Magistrates' Court, where the suspects were arraigned, the Police Prosecutor, Inspector Ejima Okete, said that the defendants

lied about thieves breaking into the premises to cart away the items

Magistrate Bola Sonuga remanded them at the Ikoyi Correctional Centre and adjourned the case till October 8th.

A similar case of alleged theft at workplace is that of Ayoke Dowe, who according to the police stole the sum of N4.5 million. He was a company accountant in a firm identified as Midak Property Limited.


Dowe, 35, was arrested by Police operatives at Maroko Division and arraigned at the Ebute-Meta Magistrates' Court where he was said to have fraudulently withdrew the sum from the company's account and converted to his use.

According to the Police Prosecutor, Gbenga Salami, the company, at Plot 19, Olowoeko Close, Jose Maria Escriva Estate, Ikate Lekki, took audit of the account and found out the missing funds. The suspect fled the scene but was later apprehended at his hideout in Lagos

In another theft case, One Kehinde Akinkugbe alongside his accomplices were arraigned for stealing transformer worth N50 million.







kinkugbe and the other accused, Tope Salisu and Isiaka Amusa were on trial on three-count of conspiracy, stealing and malicious damage, at the Ikorodu Magistrates' Court over an alleged act.

They were accused of commiting the offence on August 22, at about 2:30am along Ajeri Street, Ijede, Ikorodu, as informed by the Police Prosecutor, ASP Aminu.

Another case of theft is of three men who were accused of stealing cartons of N10 million. The suspects were arraigned at the Ikeja Magistrates' Court for allegedly stealing the items which belong to one Nneka Moses, the complainant.

Iberedem stated that two of the suspects, Saheed Olayinka, 32, Larry Olatuberu, 30, are on trial for stealing, while third accused, Francis Ezema, 27 was charged for receiving and obtaining stolen property.

They were accused of stealing Sieman Schnapps, Action Bitters, Chelsea Dry Gin, Orijin Bitters and Black Woods drinks at the complainant's shop situated in Balogun Market, Masalashi Alhaja in Agege Lagos.

One Kuju Abel is on trial for allegedly stealing a tipper of sand worth N200,000 in Badagry, Lagos.

Abel who is 32 years of age was brought before the Badagry Magistrates' Court on three count charge of conspiracy, assault and theft.

Standing as Prosecutor at the trial was

Inspector Ayodele Adeosun who told the court that the defendant and others at large stole the sand which belong to one Adeshina Lateef on July 4, around 2pm at Agumo Community in Oko-Afo, Badagry.

Another gang of six is facing trial for theft. The police arraigned the sextet for allegedly kidnapping and stealing phone worth N1,200,000.

The group were also alleged to have stolen cash and intimated a duo: Kapo Muniru and Oyedeji Samuel, the complainants.

The gang identified as E m m a n u e l Nwachukwu of age 26, Abel Odiete, 28, Divine Eta, 27, Chinedu Ihechi, 27, Titilayo Campos, 29 and one Boniface Isaiah, 32, were brought for commencement of trial at the Ikorodu Magistrates' Court.

Police Prosecutor, Inspector Adegeshin Famuyiwa, said that the suspects conspired with others at large to h a r m the complainants. He also disclosed that they are charged with conspiracy, felony to wit grievous harm, kidnapping, unlawful deprivation and stealing.

They stole a phone valued N160,000 and fraudulently withdrew the sum of N1,000,000 from one Kapo Muniru's bank account.

A 52-year old man, Samuel Jidenu, was given the task to carry out a community service as punishment for stealing.

Jidenu was arraigned and sentenced at the Badagry Magistrates' Court.



The Magistrate, Nurudeen Layeni, delivered the judgement after listening to the prosecutor, Inspector Edet Ekpo, who submitted that the offender convicted commited the act on August 6 at Povita Site of Prime Meritean in Badagry.

Reacting to the LCIS data, Justice Rahman Oshodi of the Lagos High Court, said that Oshodi/Isolo and Apapa areas currently have the highest crime rates in the state.

He disclosed that between 2018 and 2024, 62,117 inmates were enrolled in LCIS, with Lekki accounting for 13 percent of reported cases.

He said that Oshodi/Isolo, Apapa, and Ojo each followed with 10 percent, while Alimosho represented nine percent, Agege and Ikeja eight percent each, Mushin six percent, Lagos Island five percent, and Yaba four percent.

However, Epe, Ajeromi, and Victoria Island ranked lowest at two percent each, with Ikoyi slightly higher at three percent.

The statistics also highlighted the state of origin of defendants, revealing that Ogun, Oyo, and Lagos indigenes topped the list of crime suspects. He stated that Ogun

He stated that Ogun State has 17 percent of the total crimes in Lagos, amounting to 5,294 cases. Oyo State follows with 13 percent (4,090 cases), and Lagos State ranks third with 11 percent (3,295 cases).

He also stated that states like Kano, Ekiti, Ebonyi, and Abia were the lowest contributors in this category. However,





Acknowledging the challenges businesses face, Mrs. Adelabu urged the hospitality sector to communicate their specific needs so that LASPA can provide appropriate guidance

and recommend nearby parking options.

"It is essential to balance business interests with the rights of the general public. The Authority has provided ample time and opportunities for businesses to adapt. Being mindful of prevailing circumstances, it has also made provisions for suitable payment plans for those who comply", she added.

The General Manager, therefore, urged all Lagosians to support the state government's parking regulation efforts, saying "We encourage everyone to



## ESIA Adoption For Developmental Projects A Must-LASG

he Lagos State Government, has reiterated that a dopting the Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) process is a must to ensure sustainable implementation of all developmental projects in the state.

State Commissioner for the Environment and Water Resources Mr. Tokunbo Wahab emphasised this at a one-day Stakeholders **Engagement Workshop** with Financial Institutions and Professional Bodies, stating that its adoption has become necessary for all professionals in the built environment in line with global best practices.

He said the theme: "Embracing Environmental And Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) As A Critical Management And Sustainable Tool", was apt as ESIA must be embraced by both the private and public sectors to achieve sustainable development.

The Commissioner, who spoke through the Permanent Secretary, Office of Environmental Services, Dr. Tajudeen Gaji, added that EIA helps in identifying the likely adverse and beneficial impacts of a project to put in place measures to mitigate

the adverse ones. He said Lagos State remains the preferred destination for many businesses operating within the various sectors of Nigeria's economy, saying this preference can be likened to a two-sided coin which on one hand stated that Lagos is open to economic prosperity and growth and on the other hand, comes with various types of environmental

and social challenges. Wahab said the establishment of industrial facilities, creation of new settlements, and construction of infrastructure, all come with huge adverse environmental impacts ranging from pollution various environmental media (Air, Land and Water) to sometimes irreversible environmental degradation if not properly managed.

"I would like to reiterate here, that the State Government cannot afford the huge cost of addressing environmental degradation and ecological challenges resulting from unwholesome project development activities. The cost of doing the right things is cheaper than the cost of remediating or correcting the consequences of refusal

to do them", he said.

He emphasised that Environmental Impact Assessment is a formal process for identifying the likely impacts that may arise from a proposed activity or project on the environment, human health and social economic activities.

He stated that the workshop is designed to bring together all financial institutions and professional bodies in the built environment to discuss the critical role of Environmental Impact Assessment in their collective strides towards sustainable development in the State.

He explained that it is worrisome that while the government continues to see improvements in the level of compliance of the Private Sector players to the process, the same cannot be said about some

professional bodies, especially in the built environment.

He added that it has been observed that some Private Sector players have continued to execute development projects in the State without Environmental Impact Assessment.

The Commissioner reiterated that EIA has become a global decision-making tool by policymakers in protecting the Environment with nations across the globe enacting laws and setting stricter standards to ensure compliance, saying "Lagos State cannot be an exception".

He stressed that this is why the Ministry of the Environment and Water Resources is committed to continuous creating of awareness of the need for participation and compliance with the EIA process in the State.

He added that the Government has developed the Citizens Guide on EIA to educate members of the public and provide them with required information on the EIA process in the State as well as embarked on Stakeholders and major focus groups across the State.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Permanent Secretary for The Office of Environmental Services, Tajudeen Omobolaji Gaji, read by the Director, Sanitation Services Department, Dr. Hassan Sanuth, noted that EIA has become a major management tool that any nation that is determined to achieve sustainable development cannot afford to jettison in project consideration and design.

He said all the Financial

Institutions and Professional Bodies must be on the same page on the importance of EIA in project development and implementation to strike a balance between the desire for development, the need to protect the environment and public health which are not options but a necessity. The Guest Lecturer, Prof. Babajide Alo said ESIA must be executed thoroughly according to the following stages which are screening, scoping, preparing an ESIA report, publication consultation, decision making and post decision making.

He also identified the objectives of ESIA to include identifying, predicting, evaluating environmental economic and social impacts of development activities amongst others.

## Gas Emissions: LASG Inaugurates Greenhouse Registry The Special Adviser, who implement the

n its commitment to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and promoting a sustainable environment, the Lagos State Environmental Protection Agency (LASEPA), in collaboration with TPHG Technologies Limited, recently organised a Stakeholders' Engagement.

The event held at the State Treasury Resource C e n t r e , D e b t Management Office, Alausa, Ikeja was centred on the implementation of the Greenhouse Gas Registry for Lagos State, known as the Lagos Carbon Registry.

In his welcome remarks, LASEPA General Manager, Dr. Tunde Ajayi stated that the Lagos Carbon Registry is aimed at tracking and managing the State's carbon emissions, offering a critical tool for mitigating climate change and fostering environmental sustainability.

According to him, the initiative marked a significant step in the Lagos State government's efforts to become more resilient in the face of climate change, which is increasingly becoming a global threat to human existence.

Represented by the Agency's Director of Environmental Sustainability (E-Waste & Plastic Solutions), Mrs. Adedayo Adebayo, the General Manager said, "The Lagos Carbon Registry is a crucial tool in our fight against climate change. It will help us track and verify greenhouse gas emissions from various sources, identify opportunities for reduction, and promote

clean energy solutions. He explained that the registry, which will operate through an online registration, will allow stakeholders to report and track their emissions while demonstrating their commitment to environmental sustainability.

Adewale Temitope who represents Ifako-Ijaiye Constituency 01 said, "One of the responsibilities of the government is the protection of lives and property. The level of insecurity in Lagos is becoming alarming.

"The security agencies, though putting in their best, are not as effective as we expect. We need to empower the state's Neighbourhood Safety Corps.

Deputy Speaker of the House, Mojisola Meranda, who presided over the sitting on behalf of Obasa, urged the Lagos command of the Nigeria Police to do more concerning the case.

She also suggested that pending the conclusion of investigation, the police should provide security at the palace to avoid intimidation of people.

## Curbing Maternal Mortality: Lagos Trains 40 Healthcare Workers

n a continued effort to combat maternal mortality, the Lagos State Ministry of Health, in collaboration with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the Saving One Million Lives Programme for Results (SOMLPforR), organised a three-day training for healthcare workers on the active management of the third stage of labour.

Held at the Conference Centre in Alausa-Ikeja, the training sought to equip healthcare workers with the necessary skills to manage childbirth and postpartum complications, with a particular focus on preventing excessive bleeding, which remains a leading cause of maternal deaths in Nigeria.

The training, which brought together about 40 healthcare workers from primary, secondary, and tertiary healthcare facilities, was a blend of theoretical and practical sessions. Participants were exposed to clinical demonstrations using mannequins and hands-on practice with anti-shock garments and uterotonic drugs. The training is part of a larger initiative to strengthen maternal and child health services in Lagos State. Speaking on the importance of the training, the Director of Family Health and Nutrition, Lagos State Ministry of Health, Dr. Folasade Oludara noted that the training aimed to bridge the knowledge gap among newly recruited healthcare workers and update the skills of existing staff.

According to her, the training addressed one of the primary causes of maternal mortality postpartum

haemorrhage, or excessive bleeding after delivery. She explained that Postpartum haemorrhage is responsible for a significant portion of maternal deaths, both globally and in Nigeria, adding that the training focused on teaching participants the proper use of uterotonic drugs such as oxytocin and misoprostol, which help the uterus contract after childbirth to prevent excessive bleeding.

The Director said that participants were also introduced to new techniques like delayed cord clamping, which allows blood from the placenta to flow back into the newborn, reducing the risk of neonatal anaemia.

She stated that these devices are crucial in emergencies, particularly in lowresource settings where access to blood and blood products might be delayed. Dr. Oludara disclosed that the training also addressed the proper use of the partograph, a simple yet critical tool used to monitor labour and predict potential complications.

While stressing that the training also prioritised the interpersonal skills of healthcare workers, the Director noted that the workshop focused on improving communication and empathy between healthcare workers and patients to enhance the overall birthing experience.

Dr. Oludara expressed optimism that the new skills acquired by healthcare workers would lead to a significant reduction in maternal mortality



across the state, saying "We are hopeful that this training will change the narrative for us. Skilled healthcare workers are the key to reducing maternal deaths and ensuring safe deliveries",

One of the facilitators at the training, Professor Yusuf Oshodi, a renowned obstetrician and gynaecologist from the Lagos State University Teaching Hospital (LASUTH), emphasised that the training was designed to reduce Nigeria's high maternal mortality rate, which has remained unchanged for decades.

He noted that excessive bleeding and hypertensive disorders in pregnancy are the two leading causes of maternal deaths, and addressing these issues could reduce maternal mortality by 40%. "Our goal is to face these two monsters postpartum haemorrhage and hypertensive

disorders in pregnancy – which account for a large portion of maternal deaths", Professor Oshodi stated. During the event, the

Director and Reproductive Health Coordinator of the Lagos State Ministry of Health, Dr. Victoria Omoera delivered comprehensive presentation, titled: "Proposal to Improve Maternal Care, Reduce Maternal Mortality, and Strengthen Systems for Safer Childbirth".

In her address, Dr. Omoera highlighted the need for improved maternal healthcare services in low-resource settings like Lagos, where healthcare workers often lack the tools, capacity, and training needed to provide high-quality services.

She identified the main causes of these deaths as obstetric haemorrhage, hypertensive disorders, unsafe abortions, obstructed labour, and infections, noting that two-thirds of these cases involve women with no identifiable risk factors. One of the solutions, Dr. Omoera advocated for was the adoption of lowcost, high-impact interventions such as the Active Management of the Third Stage of Labour (AMTSL), which the World Health Organization (WHO) introduced in 2012.

She pointed out that AMTSL, along with the use of non-pneumatic anti-shock garments (NASG) and newer drugs like Carbetocin and Tranexamic Acid, could reduce maternal mortality by up to 60%. She stated that these measures have already been piloted in Lagos State, with significant improvements in maternal outcomes.

In closing, Dr. Omoera emphasised the need for continued capacity building for healthcare workers. She noted that the Lagos State Ministry of Health had trained 160 healthcare workers between 2019 and 2020, which slightly reduced the state's maternal mortality ratio. However, she acknowledged that more work needed to be done to meet key targets for intrapartum care.

Participants appreciated

the training, noting its practical approach and potential to save lives. Dr. Fakoya Elijah, a Medical Doctor from General Hospital Agbowa, described the training as "impactful" and emphasised the importance of continuous learning for healthcare professionals.

Edna Adinkuye, a Nurse from General Hospital, Ajeromi, shared similar sentiments, stating that the training had provided her with a better understanding of key tools like the partograph.

Lagos State is committed to reducing its maternal mortality rate, which has been gradually improving due to targeted interventions like this. With support from international partners like UNFPA and SOMLPforR, the government continues to focus on capacitybuilding programmes to ensure that healthcare workers are well-equipped to handle maternal emergencies.

Following his arrest by a team led by Inspector Charles Abikoie, the contractor was charged with multiple offences, including obtaining money by false pretences, fraud, and conduct likely to cause a breach of peace.
