# Free and fair polls: IPAC challenges LASIEC

The Inter-Party Advisory Council (IPAC) has expressed its displeasure with the delay by the Lagos State Independent Electoral Commission, LASIEC, to release guideline for the coming local government election. IPAC, an umbrella body of all political parties in the state accused LASIEC of not considering other political parties but the ruling All Progressives Congress ahead of the election.

However, facts emerged at the weekend that the LASIEC could not release the guideline now due to crisis in the ruling All Progressives Congress.

Echonews gathered that the crises in APC, one of which is the change of leadership in the House of Assembly has made LASIEC to delay the release of the guidelines.

An official of LASIEC told our correspondent that the commission had concluded necessary arrangement to release the guidelines early March so as to give about two months for political campaigns but the ongoing crisis in the major party had delayed the

government and local council development areas to sensitise the people and feel their pulses before releasing the guidelines. Speaking, the IPAC

Chairperson Temilola Akinade emphasized the importance of a timely release, as it would enable parties to adequately prepare for the election

process.

Members of all According to Akinade, APC political parties in the state are eagerly awaiting the release of LASIEC's guidelines.



"We should not, for any reason, have less than three months campaign activities " she added. Ms Akinade, however, urged all political parties to begin to put their respective houses in order ahead of primary elections and expected council elections.

Reacting, LASIEC Chairman Okikiolu-Ighile said that the commission is operating on a level playing ground and that the visits to local government areas is to ascertain the level of preparedness of every local government and local council development areas for the election before releasing the guidelines."

She revealed that the tour had made LASIEC realise that the state would need more polling units and that the commission would have to add to the number.

Recall that ahead of the 2023 general elections, the Independent National **Electoral Commission** (INEC) created 4, 861 new polling units in Lagos State, with the Alimosho Local Government Area having the highest number of new polling units of 1, 545 and followed by Kosofe local government with 899 new polling units

Okokiolu-Ighile said that as the state gears up for its muchanticipated local government elections, LASIEC will be creating additional polling units to enhance voter accessibility and ensure a seamless voting experience.

"We are putting all necessary machinery in motion to guarantee the success of these elections. The official notice will be out soon, along with the

guidelines," she announced.

She urged local government authorities to engage residents and encourage them to comply with the electoral timetable and complete all necessary validations on time. "By the grace of God, the election will hold as planned this year.

"This latest development highlights LASIEC's determination to promote transparency and inclusivity in Lagos State's electoral process. With the Lagos State House of Assembly also working to amend the LASIEC Law to curb electoral malpractice and rigging, the commission is positioned to deliver an election that reflects the true will of the people.

As preparations intensify, LASIEC's commitment to electoral excellence signals a new era of credibility and trust in the state's democratic process. Residents are encouraged to participate actively and ensure their voices are heard at the polls.

It is crucial that all members of staff uphold the highest ethical standard. Bribery, gratification and any form of misconduct will not be tolerated as these undermine the integrity of the commission. All hands are on deck to make sure we conduct credible election.

communicate the election schedule and necessary procedures in due course. She further urged all stakeholders to uphold peace, decorum, and electoral integrity throughout the process.



#### Lagos Commences Enforcement of E-Call Up System at Lekki-Epe Corridor

he Lagos State Government commenced full enforcement of the E-Call Up System, introduced to streamline and regulate truck activities along the Lekki-Epe axis of the State.

The technology-driven e-call-up system has been in the pipeline for over two years in anticipation of large vehicular traffic that will be generated by trucks assessing the Lekki Deep Seaport, Lekki Free Zone, Dangote Refinery and other industries within the axis.

With enforcement now in full effect, the State Government urges Truckers to comply with the system as several engagement meetings were held to educate stakeholders on the benefits of the e-call up and adequate time is given for all stakeholders to come on board. Similarly, the enforcement date was adjourned severally to encourage total integration and wilful compliance.

Having been given adequate room for full compliance, enforcement and operating along commenced on 24th the Lekki-Epe axis, January 2025 with and, by extension, the 10 trucks state as a whole.

## EFCC Arraigns 16 Chinese Over Alleged

o fewer than 16 Chinese suspects have been arraigned at the Federal High Court in Ikoyi Lagos over allegations of fraud.

Commission, EFCC, on Tuesday, February 25, 2025 arraigned additional 16 Chinese before Justice Daniel Osiagor of the Federal High Court, sitting in Ikoyi, Lagos for fraud.

"They are: Hu Hui (a.k.a A Bin), Liao Ri Xing (a.k.a. Li Jun), Li Qiang (a.k.a. Yang Huan Huan), A Wen, Da Tou, Cheng Jian, Cong Bing, Fei Fan, Huxi Heng, Zheng Wei (a. k. a. A Hong), Huang Zhi, Zhang Lei, Sun Zhi Peng, Huang Jin Hui, Wù Hao, and Lu Qiang.

"They are among the 792-member cryptocurrency investment and

romance fraud suspects arrested by EFCC operatives on December 10, 2024, in Lagos, in a sting operation tagged "Eagle Flush Operation".

"The suspects were arraigned on separate charges, bordering on cybercrimes, cyberterrorism, possession of documents containing false pretence, advance fee fraud and identity theft.

"They all pleaded "not guilty"to the charges when they were read to them, following which prosecution counsel, Nnaemeka Omewa, asked the court for a trial date and for the defendants to be remanded in a correctional facility."

attempted to break into the Clerk's office. He said; "This act of

defiance constitutes a clear disregard for legislative protocols and security regulations.

"The House leadership views this action as an affront to the institution's integrity and will take all necessary steps to uphold discipline and order.

"Onafeko has a pending suit against the Assembly, the Acting Clerk, and the State Government. He should focus on the legal process instead of disrupting Assembly activities, Kushoro said.

The security officer confirmed that relevant authorities had been informed, and necessary measures were being taken to prevent further security breaches.

Onafeko was dismissed as House Clerk by a two-third majority of members over alleged financial misappropriation.

However, a rulling at the National Industrial Court sitting in Lagos on Thursday sacked the acting Clerk, Babatunde Ottun, who was appointed by Speaker, Mojisola Meranda.

The court subsequently ordered the reinstatement of Onafeko as the Clerk of the House.






