## Ejigbo Rape Victim Autopsy Not Ready

arents of 11-year-old Favour Okechukwu who was raped to death in Ejigbo in September, 2020 are still mourning their

Worse, they are losing the hope of getting justice for their late daughter.

The parents are angry over the delay in releasing the autopsy conducted following the incident in November, 2020.

ECHONEWS broke the news of the death of Favour who was allegedly ganged raped to death by some hoodlums in her community at Ejigbo in September last year.

ECHONEWS reported that little Favour Okechukwu, a JSS 3 student of Deo-Lively Stone International School, was sent on an errand on Wednesday, September 30, 2020 by her mother to buy packs of gala but did not return home.

Her father, Mr. John Okechukwu, who came back from work later in the day, searched everywhere for her but to no avail.

She was later found dead in a shack located under Power Line at No 4, Olanrewaju Street, Ejigbo on Thursday, October 1, 2020.

Favour Ikechukwu, the eldest child of the five children of the family, had dreamt to be a pilot and or engineer.

However, the dream was cut short by the act of the rapists.

Subsequently, the owner of the shack known as Tabi (a.k.a Tboy) was arrested to fish out the perpetrators.

It was reported that some arrests were made after the death of Favour by the officers of Ejigbo Divisional Police led by the then DPO, Olabisi

The Lagos Commissioner of Police, Hakeem Odumosu, who later paid a visit to the bereaved parents at their residence on Wednesday, October 6, 2020, vowed to fish out the perpetrators as he directed the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Criminal Investigation Department, DCP Yetunde Longe, who accompanied him,

to deploy additional detectives from her office to go after the fleeing culprits and subject them to prosecution as soon as possible.

While vowing to get to the root of the matter, the CP promised the family of police's constant support as he reiterated his zero tolerance on crimes in Lagos State.

The father of the deceased has however decried delayed justice for her daughter about four months after her death.

He told ECHONEWS that the police are not carrying the family along in the case any

Mr. Okechukwu, who alleged foul play in the matter, lamented the delay in the result of the autopsy carried out on his late daughter.

According to him, the result was supposed to be ready after two weeks but has been delayed since November last

He explained that he was told to take the corpse from Isolo General Hospital to Ikeja General Hospital for the autopsy on November 18, 2020.

He said he later succeeded in retrieving the corpse from the mortuary and took it to lkeja where the autopsy was carried out after spending some amount of money.

"The doctor who did the autopsy told me that the result would be ready in two weeks. I was asked to return the corpse to Isolo mortuary which I did. After the two weeks, I called the doctor but he said the result was still not ready without giving me any tangible reason for the delay of the result, telling me to wait for another one week.

"But up till now, I have not received the result. I even called the doctor two days ago but told me that the result is still not ready two months after the autopsy. He even told me I was disturbing him.

the corpse from Isolo to Ikeja. After going to Panti for almost a month, they later asked me to go to the mortuary at Isolo. I was referred to the Doctor at Ikeja General Hospital who told me that they lacked years; Sunday Odunayo, aka

personnel that I should on my own go to Isolo to make arrangement to bring the corpse to Ikeja which I did. I paid all I was asked to pay. The Doctor told me to stay while the autopsy was being carried out. I stayed the whole day and I was asked to take the corpse back to Isolo."

"Forensic investigation was also carried out in the environment where my daughter was killed in October but we never have any result till date."

"In fact, they have turned the case upside down, we don't know what is happening again. But all I want is justice."

Meanwhile, the Lagos Police Command said it has arrested suspects in connection with the rape who have been charged to court.

The Lagos Police Public Relations Officer, CSP Olumuyiwa Adejobi, said the "I suffered before I could take suspects, including Ajom Princewill (male, 37 years); Aliu Adesola Bilyamin, 24 years; Emmanuel Okon, 24 years; Bolarinwa Olamilekan, 24 years; Badmus Abdullatif, 20 years; Quadri Azeez, 22

Walter, 22 years and 41 years old Omobolanle Olowookere, the only female among them, have been charged to Magistrate Court on 3-count charges bordering on conspiracy, defilement and murder.

According to him, the suspects were arraigned at Magistrate Court 3, Ebute Metta on October 30, 2020.

However, Mr. Okechukwu said the police did not inform him or any of his family about the arraignment of the suspects.

He explained that the female suspect, who was alleged to be the 'god mother' for the perpetrators of the heinous act, was released on bail the day they were taken to the agreement made with him by

He said when the suspects were taken to the court, the police did not call him until after the court had closed in the afternoon when his uncle was called that the suspects were being taken to the court. "When my uncle got there, the court had closed. It was later we got to know that the woman had been granted N500,000 bail. She was asked to vacate the community.

"She was living in the compound where my daughter was raped. We also learned that she is a nurse and that she backed those guys. She was the one who injected their victims. She injected my own daughter as well after which she died.

"It was one of the suspects who confessed at Ejigbo police station that revealed the role of the woman in the incident before she was arrested.

"When the incident happened, the then DPO of Ejigbo was trying for us and she assured us of getting justice and that was when she arrested some of the suspects. But after she six male and one female court contrary to the was transfered out of this community and the case was transfered to Panti, there has been foul play.

"I called the IPO at Panti and he assured me that they would come to me. He promised that they would always inform us as the case is going on. Only for them not to inform us that they were taking the suspects to court and granting the woman bail contrary to our agreement.

"When I learned that the

woman has been granted bail, I called my lawyer who filed a petition against the police. He also requested that the case be transferred from Ebute Metta to Ikeja. We hope that the case would be heard next in Ikeja. We have been given date for the next hearing though."

When asked what he really wants from the case, Okechukwu said: "Justice, I want justice. I want all the perpetrators to be brought to book to serve as deterrent to others. How would they grant a prime suspect a bail like that without our consent? It is not good enough, that means the justice is being tampered."

## Iniwinde educates residents on proper use of nose cover

he representative of Africa Centre for Disease Control for Isolo/Ejigbo LCDAs, Mrs. Ayodeji Oniwinde has drawn the attention o the public to the wrong way people wear medical-grade mask.

While demonstrating the proper way of wearing the mask to the members of the Community Development Committee (CDC) at Ejigbo council secretariat, Oniwinde explained that it is a 3-layer mask that has a rubber strap at the upper layer and a free part at the lower layer.

According to her, the blue shaded side of the mask is the outer part while the white shaded side is the inner part for the covering of the nose.

"It is assumed that the size of your thumb is the size of your nose bridge so it is placed at the middle of the mask dividing the mask into two equal parts."

She cautioned that the rubber strap should be pressed on the thumb in order to fit in the shape of the nose bridge before opening the three layers of the mask and placing the rubber part on the bridge of the nose for covering.

"You should try to breathe out large air to confirm that there is no air escaping channel after placing the mask because the virus can be transmitted or contracted if there is any opening."

Oniwinde disclosed that the constriction of air will not suffocate the user as it is safer than allowing the egression of


Commenting on the local council's efforts towards

he residents of Lafenwa community have appealed to Ikeja **Electricity Distribution** Company (IKEDC) to lessen the conditions attached to the return of their transformer.

The company has mandated each customer on the transformer to pay 10 per cent of their outstanding bills before the transformer could be returned.

However, the residents complained that the 10 per cent was much, claiming that they were given estimated

They said they were charged for the power they did not consume, noting that they have not consumed electricity since June 2020 when their

transformer developed fault company has promised to and was taken away by IKEDC officials.

Speaking with ECHONEWS, the chairman of the community, Ejigbo Central Community Development Association (CDA), Prince Shakiru Ojoola, said the company has been over billing them even when there was no light.

Meanwhile, he said an agreement was reached by both parties and that the




The CDC chairman, Prince Jelili Atiku, said the committee has visited the burnt police post to assess the level of the damage and estimate the cost of rebuilding the station.
