# Pa Adegoke for burial Nov 26

The remains of the former chairman of the All Progressives Congress, APC in Ejigbo Local Council Development Area, Pa Michael Adegoke will be committed to the earth on Friday, November 26, this year.

The event will hold at Okemesi-Ekiti in Ekiti State. Peter Adegloke, his son, told ECHONEWS that the funeral ceremonies will begin on Tuesday, November 23, this year with a wake-keep.

On Wednesday, the body will be moved to Okemesi- Ekiti to be prepared for a second wake-keep on Thursday, November 25, this year.

On Friday, November 26, this year, there will be a funeral service followed by internment.

An elaborate reception will be held on Saturday, December 2, this year in Lagos.

The family continues to finalise funeral arrangements as more dignitaries and sympathisers through the home of the Adegokes to pay their respects.

They include the former Lagos State chairman of APC, Chief Oladele Ajomale, the member representing Oshodi-Isolo Constituency II in the Lagos House of Assembly, Hon. Jude Idimogu and the chairman of Ejigbo LCDA, Hon. Monsurudeen Bello Obe.

A 13-year old Ayobami Vincent has described late Michael Adegoke as an elder that has lived a fulfilled life being a vicegerent of God on earth.

According to him, he has been a major source of

Recalling an incident that transpired between Adegoke and himself, Vincent disclosed that late Adegoke lived his life as the voice of the voiceless to all.

Politically, while speaking, the All Progressives

## Madrasa Riyaadhil Qur'an graduates second set of Qur'an memorisers

A 13-year-old Rahmah Ma'ruf, who represented Lagos State in the junior category of the famous Lagos for Qur'an competition which has representatives in all 36 states of the federation, Rahmah Ma'ruf, has completed her memorisation of the 114 chapters of the holy Qur'an along with other 13 students

They were graduated by Madrasatu Riyaadhil Qur'an

Tahfeedzil Qur'an wa Ta'leem during the weekend.

Another young graduate is a 14 years old Khabbab Yusuf who is also part of the second set of the students graduated by the school after seven years of its establishment.

The young Rahmah Ma'ruf with long, unique, tiny but loud voice who also featured in the intermediate category of 2021 national Qur'an competition held in Kano where she represented Alimosho local government in Jama'atu Izaala Qur'an competition and got 1st

position, completed her memorisation within 2 years and some months.

Speaking with ECHONEWS about their experience during the memorisation course, Rahmah Ma'ruf and her classmate, Khabbaab Yusuf who speaks Arabic language fluently among his peers commented that their competence was built within six months as they learned to be disciplined and determined during their memorisation course.

According to them, to retain the memorised portions of

Qur'an, students must avoid sin, ensure daily revision, portray a guided act in behaviour, use it for administration and dispensing judgment.

The proprietor of the school, Madrasatu Riyaadhil Qur'an Tahfeedzil Qur'an wa Ta'leemi Deen, Ustadha Ibrahim Afuwape, urged the students who have just completed their memorisation course to reflect the divine light that has been bestowed on them through memorisation of the holybook.

While congratulating them on the successful completion of one of their religious obligation, the Islamic scholar said memorising the Qur'an would make them wiser, help them do away with social vices, violence, and inculcate righteousness, decency and chastity in them.

Afuwape urged parents to encourage their children to memorise Qur'an, saying it would become a means for them to attain success in their lifetime and hereafter because it sharpens the

intellect of the memoriser. He added that memorising the holy book at tender age also helps the student to attain excellent performance in their western education. Applauding the efforts of the graduates, the Deputy Vice Chancellor of Kwara State University, Professor Luqman Jimoh, said that from experience, many if the children who memorise Qur'an excel in their western education, saying memorising the holy book is an additional knowledge for a believer.

## Olasoju gives contractors guidelines standard on road works

**T**he Chairman of Isolo LCDA, Otunba Adebayo Olasoju has given the contractors handling the rehabilitation of Marani and Aderinto Streets the guidelines for their projects.

Wunmi-Waterlotion Nigeria Limited and Dakayne Height Limited are the contractors working on Aderinto and Marani respectively.

According to the council boss, the project must be durable with perfect drainage systems on both sides of the roads to ensure the free flow of water.

He re-emphasised the standard specification when he

inspected the projects which commenced last week for assessment.

Though he expressed satisfaction with the little job done on the road, Olasoju said the quality must be maintained and probably increased to gibe the project perfect finish.

He, therefore, assured the residents across the council area of equal treatment in the provision of infrastructures, saying each community would soon get its share of the dividend of democracy.

He, therefore, charged the CDA executives to closely supervise the projects and caution residents and shop owners against abuse of the road and indiscriminate

extension of their shop on the drains.

He also made made case for regular environmental sanitation, warning that his administration will not take waste management, road and drainage maintenance with levity.

His words: "Of course, we are cognizant of other areas that are begging for our attention and we will work on them. We will leave no stone unturned until we reposition our council area to be the first among others in the state in terms of durable road networks. We call on CDAs and residents to supervise these projects and cooperate with the contractors while the construction lasts."

## INEC registers 573 new voters in the first month

**N**o fewer than 573 new voters have registered and received their Permanent Voter's Cards (PVC) from the National Electoral Commission (INEC) since the commencement of the exercise in the Oshodi-Isolo Local Government Area. As gathered by ECHONEWS, the number was recorded within four weeks.

In the first week, 107 people were registered from Monday to Friday beginning with 15 on Monday, 28 on Tuesday and,

23,20,21 on the other days. In the second week, 160 new voters were registered with daily records from Monday beginning with 25 on Monday and 30, 35,30,40 on other days.


The Commission recorded 165 in the third week in series of 30, 32,40, 39,24 on daily basis, while it got the lowest number in the fourth week with the total number of 141. Their daily record of 30, 25, 35, 29, 22 from Monday to Friday.

The total number includes new PVC registration, relocation issues, defaced

PVCs missing PVCs, Omission cases and information update on names. There were cases of 12 missing PCVs throughout the four weeks in the sequence of 6, 1, 2 and 3 weekly.

For information updates on PVC such as change of name, INEC officials explained that affidavits or print publication must be presented as evidence.

However, they complained that network fluctuation has been the major challenge, slowing down the speed of the exercise.



# How we stopped long-distance transfer of workers - NULGE

To reduce cases of marital conflict, transport expenses, accommodation, among others, the chairman of the National Union of Local Government Employees (NULGE), Ejigbo LCDA,

Comrade Sadiq Lawal, said the body ensures that workers are not transferred to local government areas far from their homes.

According to him, the Union was able to convince the Local Government Service Commission to always consider the convenience of the workers when transferring

them from one local council to another.

Lawal said there were many cases of marital conflicts when workers were transferred far away from their homes, which prompted the Union to approach the Commission for consideration of workers' residence when reposting them.

He stated that the Union usually follows up the transfer of the workers to make sure they are not posted far from their homes considering their new home addresses after relocation.

On the issue of transportation, he confirmed that the chairman of Ejigbo LCDA, Hon. Monsurudeen Bello Obe,

during his first tenure, provided private owned cars to all Heads of Units and Heads of Department for easy movement.

Explaining the achievements of the Union in the last six years he has been in office, Lawal explained that the Union has built an N6 million local government NULGE office

independently, and provided relief packages to retirees of the council.

On welfare, Lawal said the Union provided equipment such as grinding machines, photocopy machines, and the like to retirees who have the physical ability to work rather than becoming helpless and cashless when they retire.

He appreciated the efforts of the former chairman of Ejigbo LCDA, Hon. Kehinde Bamigbetan, for introducing a quick loan scheme with zero per cent interest to the union, saying the scheme is being sustained to date.

# GCE screen test failure worries stakeholders

Poor performance of prospective beneficiaries in a screening test for a scheme to sponsor candidates for the forthcoming General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level in Oshodi-Isolo LGA is giving the organisers serious concern.

The organisers of the programme pegged the pass mark at 70 for the 50 applicants. However, only two scored 70 while 21 others scored 50 marks and above, making 23 students who have qualified for the free forms.

The abysmal performance of the

students has forced the organisers to reduce the pass marks to 50.

The two students who scored above 70 are Kehinde Lawal, an SS2 going to SS3 student of Oshodi Comprehensive High school, who scored 77, and Boluwatife Alagbe, a 2019 SS3 graduate of Ikeja Senior College, who scored 72 marks.

Speaking with ECHONEWS, Lawal, who aspires to study Medicine, promised to make judicious use of the opportunity by studying harder to pass the General examination and gain admission into a University immediately after his secondary school.

He was over joyous for coming out the overall best in the test, saying his performance has raised his hope of becoming a medical doctor.

In the same vein, Alagbe also promised to make use of the opportunity to turn her dream of studying Economics at OAU into reality by making her result from the GCE.

Alagbe said she could not gain admission into a higher institution because she made her result in two sittings but she needs it in one sitting.

She expressed her determination to put all efforts into the examination to make her result this time in one sitting.

Commenting on the students' performances, the coordinator of the programme, Engr. Olusola Dahunsi appealed to political leaders to buy into the idea of conducting tests before giving out academic awards such as GCE/JAMB forms and other scholarships.

explained that such tests would always allow the right students to have the awards instead of getting into the wrong hands who would mess up the opportunities. He informed that 23 beneficiaries would get the GCE forms, but then the beneficiaries will be increased if there are more GCE forms from donors to encourage more participation next time.

## Elewu charges govt, Eko Excel to upgrade schools

The Elewu of Ewu Kingdom, His Royal Majesty, Oba Shakirudeen Kuti Erufa 1, has charged the government to upgrade public primary schools to encourage parents to enrol their wards.

He made the statement in support of the advocacy by Eko Excel for more wards to be enrolled in the government primary schools across Oshodi-Isolo Local Government Area.

Elewu said the public primary schools in the local government area need to be upgraded, noting that the structures in some of the schools have become dilapidated.

Though he commended the effort of the local government towards primary education, he demanded more to raise the standard to compete with the contemporary schools.

He promised to play his role by sensitising the community members to patronise public schools.

He, therefore, charged the management of Eko Excel to also do its part in raising the standards of public primary schools through teacher training in digital technology.

Eko Excel is an education reform programme that is successfully developing more highly skilled teachers; by training, supporting and motivating existing government teachers to succeed in their classrooms.

Meanwhile, one of the

supervisors at Eko Excel, Monica Obi, told ECHONEWS that the system of public primary schools in Lagos State has positively changed to meet up with the standard in private schools.

According to her, such changes include the digital system of operation through the use of tablets by teachers to deliver lessons, teacher training, skill acquisition centres for pupils: home economics, art and craft.

Equally speaking, the Lagos State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) Supervisor of schools in Oshodi-Isolo, Mrs Nafisat Akinsola encouraged parents and guardians to enrol their wards in the public primary schools.

According to her, Lagos State Government has, in the last two years, focused on the transformation of the educational sector in a redefined

way.

Akinsola said a good education reform programme such as the Eko Excel has been introduced into the system to develop highly skilled teachers through training, supporting and motivating them to succeed in classroom activities.

She noted that part of the training was to provide teachers with tablets to understand new teaching skills and ways of impacting their pupils.

In her words: "The idea of Eko Excel is that all primary school teachers will have a single means of identifying what their curriculum will be and be able to time in and time out.

"The principals and vice-principals will also have their monitoring tablets to check on activities of every teacher under them to know which teacher uploaded and treated the lessons while monitoring them

off-site."

She stated that the project is beneficial because it is set to create an enabling environment for pupils to love school and their teachers so that their cognitive reasoning is enhanced which is why they are encouraging all residents to ensure enrolling their kids in public primary schools as they have been reformed.

Akinsola disclosed that kindergarten and nursery classes have been established which gives privilege to kids from age three to attend public primary schools in Lagos

She appreciated the efforts of her colleagues, the School-Based Management Committee (SBMC), Mr Sunday Adebisi and SUBEB Supervisor of schools in Oshodi-Isolo, Mrs Koffi Idara, for ensuring that vital information is disseminated to residents in Oshodi-Isolo LGA.
